Like the Oakland County 4-H fair's 25-cent bottomless glass of chocolate milk, this year's festivities offered an enjoyable experience for the whole family from July 25-31. Unlike the milk though, the fair will take a year to refill the Oakland County fairgrounds in Davisburg.

"It was a record breaking fair for us. We caught the weather just right and there was a lot of curiosity about the Ellis Barn. I can't believe it came together for us so well," said LC Scramlin, general manager of the 4-H fair.

Over 90,000 people flocked into the 4-H fair this year, setting a new attendance record.

"It was such a blessing that it cooled down. Three or four of the fair's days were the nicest days of summer," said Scramlin.

While the easy breezes sweeping

across the fairgrounds helped bring people through the gates, some new takes on old exhibits ensured a good visit.

The Miracle of Birth Barn, which in years past was in a tent, was in a brand new barn this year. The change of scenery did a lot to help the visibility level of the exhibit which featured calfs, piglets, ducklings and many other animals born just before or during the fair.

"Many people thought it was the first time we'd had a live birth exhibit. It was almost shocking," said Scramlin.

The live animal birth barn was one of three new structures enjoying their debut at the fair. Another new building housed a "Farmer for a Day" hands-on activity and the livestock were housed in a new barn as well.

Another drawing point to the fair was another new barn, the Ellis barn restoration project. While the basement and first

## Clarkston local gives perspective

Regiani studying in England during second London bombing

Forty-eight hours before Sherry and Angie Regiani of Clarkston left for Europe, the discouraging news broke that three subway cars and a bus were bombed by terrorists in London.

The mother and daughter were to leave Detroit for Nice on July 9. Angie, 19, was to attend the Loban Contemporary Dance School, in London, for two weeks of professional dance training beginning July 18.

Before deciding to continue with the planned trip Sherry Regiani, 52, checked with friends overseas.

"My thought is if something is going to happen, it could happen whenever wherever," said Sherry. "So we went ahead with our plans anyway."

"Angie had the opportunity to go and we had the air miles, so we went," she continued. "For the rest of her life she will remember this. I didn't want her to say 'When I was 19, I had an opportunity to go to London, but my parents were afraid.""

"We initially flew into Nice, took a day trip to Monaco and then flew to stay with friends in Paris. We took the Eurostar (train) from Paris to London," said Angie.

She added the trip through the Chunnel under the English Channel took three and a half hours.

Angie is a junior at Point Park University in Pittsburgh, Penn. studying musical theater with a dance minor. She works for a dance tour group, Pillow Project Dance Company, that performs three weekends a month

"It is a very go, go, go life style. You live life on the road, especially when you are with a tour group. It is what you expect when you go into this business; you have to just pick up your life and go," said Angie, who flies roughly three weekends a month so she is quite familiar with travel security. "This was my first trip across the pond."

In the wake of the bombings Sherry and Angie found security heightened in many places.

"We went up in the London Eye (a big Ferris wheel that takes 30 minutes to go around). They searched everything, backpacks, everything, and even waiting in

## Shell armed robbery suspects apprehended

Two suspects in the July 18 armed robbery of the Shell Service Station at the northwest corner of I-75 and Sashabaw Road were arrested and arraigned.

### Fortinberry hearing adjourned

The hearing on the judicial misconduct charges against 52nd District Court Judge Dana Fortinberry is adjourned from Aug. 8 until Nov. 28

According to Examiner Paul Fischer of the Michigan Judicial Tenure Commission, the attorney for Judge Fortinberry was called to jury duty for the week originally set in August. Several scheduling conflicts between the involved parties during rescheduling attempts resulted in the November 28 date, said Fischer.

With witness lists exchanged, the parties involved are now simply waiting for the hearing to start said Fischer.

The Hon. Robert A. Benson (retired) will serve as master of the hearing and make a recommendation to the Michigan Judicial Tenure Commission.

As stated on the commission's Web site, after the public hearing, the Michigan Judicial Tenure Commission will review the matter and, if warranted, make a recommendation to the Michigan Supreme Court regarding possible sanctions against Judge Fortinberry. The Supreme Court may then take action against Fortinberry using that recommendation.

Horn, 18, both of Highland Park, allegedly held an employee at gunpoint while taking approximately \$200 in various bills and quarters around 3:28 a.m.

An anonymous caller contacted the Oakland County Sheriff's Office on July 20 stating the person in the publicly released surveillance video was Goodson. After researching Goodson, detectives produced a photo lineup from which the employee decisively identified Goodson as one of the persons who robbed the store.

Using another tip, deputies alerted Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit that Goodson may arrive at their facilities. On July 24, Goodson showed up at Henry Ford and was detained.

Goodson was questioned and confessed to the robbery. He was arraigned in 52-2 District Court on one count of armed robbery before Magistrate E. Chiappelli on July 25. Bond was set at \$250,000 cash (no 10 percent payment for bail allowed).

On July 25 Cierra Horn, surrendered to Independence Township detectives at the OCSO Detective Bureau. She was interviewed and confessed to being an active and willing participant in the robbery.


Horn was also charged with armed robbery and Independence Township substation. Bond was set at \$50,000 (no 10 percent payment for bail allowed).

Baldes said Horn has no prior criminal record. Goodson was recently released from parole for a 1997 armed robbery conviction in Oakland County 6th Circuit Court and has a previous conviction for receiving register. The two then fled on foot toward Sashabaw and concealing stolen property in Detroit.

Detectives reported recovering a gun suspected in the robbery, but found no money.

According to a report from the Oakland County Sheriff's Office, the Shell station employee, James L. Thompson of White Lake, 45, reported after the robbery that the couple came into the station around 2:30 a.m. claiming they had a flat tire and needed a phone book to call for towing services. The couple asked Thompson for the best route to Flint and then left on foot toward Sashabaw Road.

The report continues that an hour later, at approxiarraigned July 27 according to Sergeant Baldes of the mately 3:25 a.m., the couple returned, waiting for a few minutes until a customer left. According to statements Goodson then allegedly pulled a pistol and pointed it at Thompson as he and Horn went over the counter.

Goodson demanded Thompson open the safe (which he cannot do) as Horn took the cash from the Road and I-75 as stated in the report.

Goodson was observed making a cell phone call before the robbery and talked on the phone throughout







## Local teens learn best lessons outside of class

from St. Daniel Catholic Church proved life lessons sometimes are best learned outside the classroom.

From July 10-16, adult and youth members of St. Daniel worked on a Tennessee mission trip to help the less fortunate with their homes while sharing a rewarding spiritual experience.

On their own, the youth chose to seek During the summer recess, youth out God's message from the rain that plagued the trip rather than lament, said Maxwell.

Benefits from the trip extended beyond helping those in need. Timm said the mission placed responsibility on the kids to work together to prepare the meals and set up tents in a rustic setting.

"I really saw different types of people come together and unite. We worked well together," said youth Anne Maxwell. "I learned a lot from the lady whose house I worked on. She was a widow, but she was generous and humble and really a great lady."

The effort put forth by the parish's young adults was not lost on Timm. —

"I really enjoyed the positive high energy youth. Working with them in a situation like this gives me a lot of hope. Seeing kids come together and facing things they fear, like heights on a roofing job was an experience... We worked through that together and it's neat to see them come through the challenges," said Timm.

Maggie, making the trip for her fourth time, saw good will flourhish among the group. An affirmation ceremony at the end of the week - where the kids sat in a circle and said two things they liked about others on the trip - exemplified the atmosphere.



School is out, the temperatures are rising, and it is time for lazy days at the pool or on the beach. Swimming is one of the country's most popular summertime activities, and the Great Lake State is no exception. Before you dive in, however, please practice healthy swimming behaviors. These rules apply to all types of recreational water, including swimming pools, water parks, hot tubs, lakes, rivers, or the ocean.

According to the Center for Disease Control, there has been an increase over the past decade of recreational water illnesses (RWIs). RWIs are illnesses that are spread by swallowing, breathing, or having contact with contaminated water. Symptoms range from skin, ear, and eye infections to respiratory infections, but the most common infections are diarrheal illnesses. These are caused by Cryptosporidium, Giardia, Shigella, and E. Coli.

If swimmers are ill with diarrhea and have an "accident" in the pool, then millions of germs can be released. On average, people have 0.14 grams of feces on their bottoms, and if they do not rinse off. then these germs are also released into the water. Lakes, rivers, and the ocean can be contaminated

by sewage spills, animal waste, and water runoff after rainfalls. Many of the diarrhea-causing germs do not have to be swallowed in large amounts to cause symptoms. The young, elderly, and immunecompromised are the most at risk.

How can you help to protect your family and prevent the spread of recreational water illnesses? Healthy swimming behaviors are needed to stop germs from getting into the water in the first place:


- 1. Don't swim when you have diarchea. This is especially important for kids wearing diapers.
- 2. Don't swallow the water. Try not to get any water into your mouth.
- 3. Practice good hygiene. Shower before swimming and wash your hands after using the toilet or changing diapers.
- Take children on frequent bathroom breaks and check diapers often.
- Change diapers in a bathroom, not at poolside.

## Independence Township receives audit

Auditors Plante & Moran, PLLC gave Independence Township a positive opinion after reviewing the township's financial records.

According to Plante & Moran's financial report, Independence Township saw a revenue increase of \$1.5 million in 2004 due mainly to an increased property tax base. However, the township did experience a decrease in state shared revenues of approximately \$200,000. State shared revenues account for almost 40 percent of general revenues.

In addition, township expenditures increased by around \$1.4 million, or 9 percent. The increase was mainly due to wage increases and growth in demand for township services.

In Plante & Moran's opinion, the township was cautioned to continue "very conservative budgeting for revenues," considering the consistent decrease in state shared revenues.

While the township did receive a good bill of fiscal health. Plante & Moran looked for ways to improve the township's accounting management. The following recommendations were made:

 Review all outstanding checks, especially those still dating in the 90s. Cancel when appropriate so the balance can be returned to the township's cash balance.

 Minor differences continue to show between the bank reconciliations and the general ledger. Make sure to investigate these differences each month and record any adjustments immediately.

· Review and update capital outlay accounts quar-

 Make sure expenses are recorded when services are received, not by the invoice date. For example, services received before Dec. 31 should be recorded as such, not by the January invoice.

· Adopt a formal policy on the use of township credit

The township's financial report, which includes supplemental information and discusses all township accounts, is available for public inspection at the township offices.





## Softball league stresses fun and community

When they swing the bat, the ball streaks into the outfield. They hit singles and double, make outs in the field, cheer for their teammates and lament over

Any handicap of the special-needs players on the Independence Township Parks and Recreation therapeutic softball team is left in the dugout when softball season begins.

"The biggest thing for them is being part of a team and the camaraderie that comes with that," said Douglas Fox, coach of the Blue Hawks, whose son, Ian, has played for the past four years. "Everyone is competitive and always gives 100 percent to their own individual level."

The softball portion of Parks and Recreation therapeutic activities program begins in April with weekly practices. During the season, the team plays eight games against other teams from surrounding areas such as Lake Orion, Rochester, West Bloomfield, Waterford and

"(The players) definitely improve as the season goes on and we really have a lot of fun," said Sheila Turk, who helps coordinate the therapeutic recreation softball team.

The benefits of the league extend past the players involved. The weekly games offer parents of special-needs children a chance to build their own sense of community.

"This is the only league where (a player) can run to first and get a hug from the first baseman," said Nancy Kwapisz, whose son Tony is a veteran on the Blue

Many of the players have participated since the league began in 1993.

"They excel in this. They are all disabled, when they excel in something it really makes them feel good," said Valerie Laidler, whose son Ben is also a longtime member of the Blue Hawks.

The opening day parade at Clintonwood Park on June 4 marked the beginning of the season. Over the course of two months the teams played a 12-game schedule.







line there were armed security," said Sherry. "There was security everywhere, police and armed military, guns in arms and at the ready, not just over the shoulder. In downtown Paris on Bastille Day, July 14, there were armed military on every street corner, there was a very visible presence."

Sherry described the people of London and Paris as very wary. She said Londoners were getting back to normal, but the security was "very much present."

"Londoners are very determined," said Sherry. "You could hear a lot of talk, 'We will get them. Here are the pictures, and we are going to get them."

Sherry spent a week traveling Europe with Angie to the tourist sites. They both say they saw a lot while in London, but did not see any of the destruction caused by the terrorists. They said they went by the sites, but could not see any damage.

Angie was in class in Laban, London when the second set of bombs went off July 21.

"I was there for the 'kind of fake' bombs. They didn't actually explode, it was more of an implosion. They just caused a ruckus," said Angie. "Some people left (class) early, some walked all the way home because they didn't want to take the tubes (London's underground subway) home. It kind of changed the way people were commuting everywhere" said Angie.

"Actually, I wasn't scared. You don't let it interfere with your life. That is what they (the terrorists) want," she said, "I just wasn't going to let it interfere with my studying over there."

Angie said after the "dummy bombs" there was an even greater police presence. They were in the ticket pooths, on the trains, on the platform to board the trains, under ground and above ground.

"The police wore bright green jackets and they were ill over the tube station. Any tube station would have

them, they were a very visible presence," said Angie. Angie stayed in Grenwich, a burrow just outside of London, for two weeks. She said she frequently traveled between the two towns and would go into central London three or four times a week. She said the distance to class was short so she walked a lot.

Angie also said she took the Docklands Railway, an above ground train that only goes underground for

"You do feel a little safer because it is an above ground mode of transportation," Angie said

She added that people avoided the tube the first day-either taking taxis the bus or walking.

"The tubes were closed, where the bombs went off, but it effected the entire station, so if you had to make a connection or had to get off it could be difficult," said Angie.

"Most Londoners had the attitude that they were not going to let it bother them; I am not going to let this disturb my life. Most people handled themselves very well and were not biased to another ethnicity."

Angie said speed and convenience makes public transportation the preferable mode of conveyance. She said if police checked every bag and preformed high security searches like air and tube travel that public transportation would not be as efficient.

"You might as well have your own car," she concluded.

"I wouldn't have done anything differently; I was there to soak it all up," Angie added. "I loved London and I would go again in a heart beat."

Sherry said she was not afraid to have Angie in

London. She credits an international cell phone with alleviating a lot of fear. She said communication with her daughter was key.

"Really no, I was not afraid. I'm a Christian woman and I really believe a lot in faith, and I believed we we're going to be okay. Of course, I prayed a lot after I came home when Angie was still in London, especially with the second little incident," said Sherry. "This whole generation is growing up in a whole different world and they seem to take it all in stride because that is the world that they know."

Angie arrived home late on July 30 and left for Pittsburgh on August 2. She starts her junior year of college at the end of August and plans a career on stage in New York when she graduates.



## A family of firsts...

#### 'We moved to the country when the country wasn't cool'- Callie Johnson

In 2005, it's easy to look back 50 years and smile. In 1955, the decision to move to the Clarkston area was a courageous one.

Back then, Callie and Walter Johnson married and decided to move their children from the projects in Pontiac to the country of Springfield Twp. for a better upbringing.

The family headed to a small, newly developed subdivision off Big Lake Road and their new home on Villa Crest Drive.

According to the family the area, advertised as an all African American neighborhood, was built for families who wanted their children to grow up outside the city. Callie wanted her children to have a better education and a better life.

"It was rural when we first moved out there. Not like it is now. It was swampy, and people would come out to see me and say 'How did your mom find this place," said daughter Brooksie Newton, 56.

Gregory Johnson, 50, son of Callie and Walter, remembers in the 1970s bussing being a big issue for the inner city schools. He said the state was going to send urban children to the suburban schools for a better education.

"The neighborhood just exploded then," said Gregory.

More homes were built as more and more families moved from the inner city.

Callie Johnson had nine children, five from an earlier marriage: William Douglas, born in 1936; Roslynn Douglas, 1938; Callie Douglas, 1941; Errol Douglas, 1943; Brooksie Newton, 1947; Gregory Johnson, 1955; Darrell Johnson, 1959 - 1999; Mark Johnson, 1962; and Tammy (Johnson) Pittman, 1963. Callie is grandmother to more than 30 children and great-grandmother to more children than the family can count. Pittman said the grandchildren live all over the United States.

The Johnson family was nominated as

"Family of the Year" by the Michigan Women's Christian Temperance Union in 1985. An article in *The Clarkston News*, Oct. 1985, describes Callie Johnson as "a woman of fundamental convictions, optimistic, friendly and compassionate." The article said her life was her family and her church.

Johnson's children remember her as strict. Newton and Pittman said they were not allowed to date in high school. Newton remembers her mother once chaperoned her and sat between her and her beau at the movies.

Johnson describes herself in the Northwest Oakland County Herald, Dec. 1985, "I guess I was a little strict. They couldn't go to parties and dances. They lived by the religion of the house. I chose what they could watch on television."

The children remember when their mom would turn the television off if a swear word was said.

On a lazy Saturday morning, you hear the door bell and think: Who is there? What do they want? As you open the door, a young man is waiting with a Bible in hand. You already know he a Jehovah's Witness. In thirty to sixty seconds, you have turned down the pleasant young man at your door and his offer of a small magazine about the Bible.

Why did he come? Why on Saturday? What makes

a person willing to talk about something as personal as religion to total strangers?





## Family from Jerusalem visits Calvary Evangelical Lutheran

Calvary Evangelical Lutheran Church of Clarkston received some special guests last week.

Pastor Ibrahim Azar and his family, of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of the Redeemer in Jerusalem, spent part of their four week vacation in the United States sharing faith with their companion congregation here in Clarkston.

In addition to the Azar family's trip this summer, the relationship resulted in two groups from Calvary visiting Azar's church in Jerusalem and the exchange of signed banners between the two churches.

Currently, a yellow banner sporting the signatures of many members of Azar's church hangs in Calvary Evangelical Lutheran Church, while a similar banner with the signatures of its members hangs in Jerusalem.

The interaction and cultural exchange impacted all involved.

"Our family relationship is obvious. We are in the same family. I read the Old Testament differently now," said Pastor Ameritus Bob Walter, who visited Jerusalem.

Walter also noted there is no denominational difference between the two churches and highlighted 'amen' as being one common word between Arabic and English, pronounced the same way.

Azar, who spoke at several of Calvary's services, discussed his family's reception at the church.

"We feel we are here not as strangers, but among brothers and sisters received in a brotherly fashion, like family. It's been a beautiful experience," said

"We haven't felt strange at this church. It's the same way of thinking, different in language not spirit."


"Most people don't think of Palestinians as Christians," said Azar's wife Nahla.

Azar and his wife, while stressing they are not politicians, see many differences between life in the United States, including Clarkston, and in Jerusalem.

"People here are more free, they are not as tense in life with activities. I feel people are more open... You can feel life in the congregation. It's more joyful, they have a much different situation," said

Nahla expressed frustration with conditions near her church that often prevent people from celebrating their Chris-

to pray. We want the people to be involved in the church, but because of the checkpoints, people spend two or three hours waiting and sometimes can't get through," said Nahla.

Besides visiting Clarkston, the Azars visited many places including Huckleberry Railroad in Crossroad Village, the New England Area and San Diego.

Azar said he enjoyed seeing items with tradition in the United States like the steam engines in Crossroad Village, because everything here looks so new.

'We went to Cedar Point and it was

amazing. The girls enjoyed it and all wanted to go on the roller coasters. We also went to a yogurt factory and beer factory in New Hampshire," said Nahla.

Both Azar and Nahla expressed hope for the future world in which their daughters will become adults.

"I hope our girls will grow up in a Christian atmosphere. The number of Christians in the Holy Land is not more than 2 percent. Many Christians are leaving and it will be tough to have a Christian identity among Jewish and Muslim people," said Ibrahim.



Gregory Johnson remembers taking a trip to Canada with his college girlfriend without telling his mother. Mrs. Johnson was so frantic she called every hospital in Michigan, every police department and every friend Gregory had.

Pittman says she did not date until after high school. She remembers her mom went everywhere with them, to all their school and sporting events.

"I never sent the kids with anyone — I took them. We have fun together. I went everywhere the kids went," Johnson said in the Northwest Oakland County Herald.

Six of Johnson's children attended the Clarkston School District. Daughter Callie was the first African American to graduate from Clarkston High School in 1960.

Tragically, brother Darrell Johnson, a 1976 graduate, died of heart failure in 1999. He was known for his piano playing and was a member of CHS Madrigals.

Newton graduated in 1966. She sang in choir and the play "My Fair Lady." She took forensics (speech) and competed at the state level. She was the first African American to participate in the CHS Junior Miss Contest.

Newton, a Pontiac resident, retired in 2002 from the Pontiac Public Schools where she worked for more than 22 years as a bus driver and custodian. She said growing up in Clarkston was lonely and prefers the urban setting where she raised her family.

Gregory Johnson graduated from Clarkston in 1974. Of his many accom-

plishments in high school, he played Tevye in Fiddler on the Roof, and Baron Von Trap in The Sound of Music. He wrestled and was captain the team his senior year. He started playing trombone in the fifth grade, and still plays in weekend jam sessions in downtown Pontiac. He says he misses his brother; he could really use a piano player.

Gregory lives in Pontiac with his family and works for General Motors. He will retire in December of 2006.

Mark Johnson graduated in 1980 and enlisted into the Marine Corps. He currently works for Blue Cross Blue Shield. He is a writer and poet; and has written for radio stations. He lives with his family in Detroit.

Tammy (Johnson) Pittman, 43, graduated from Clarkston in 1981. She participated in many activities in school, but is known for being the only African American cheerleader.

Pittman started working for the U.S. Postal Service in 1986 and transferred to the Clarkston office in October 2004. She said she enjoys being there.

"I have been so happy just to see all my classmates and teachers, the playground teachers, everyone," said Pittman.

She lived in Detroit for ten years until she was married and moved with her family to Davisburg.

Callie Johnson's oldest children were born in Memphis, Tenn. and did not attend Clarkston schools.

William Douglas is an artist in Missouri and goes by the name Zookstone. He draws chalk and pencil sketches. Roslynn Douglas is a retired dietician living in Detroit. Errol Douglas lives with his family in Trenton and uses his talent in photography. Daughter Callie Douglas

lives in Texas and works for a church.

Callie Johnson passed away June 26, 2001, at the age of 81. Walter Johnson passed away in January of 2005 and was a resident of Clarkston for more than 50 years. He worked for General Motors and retired after 31 years. He sold the family home in 2003. Regrettably, none of the children were able to purchase the property.

The ten homes originally built in the 50s "All African" neighborhood have blossomed into a full neighborhood. The

roads are still dirt, but the homes are newly renovated and remodeled. The children agree there is little resemblance to the neighborhood where they grew up.

Gregory Johnson said he is not interested in going back to see the old family home.

"If I had to do it all again, I wouldn't change a thing. I loved growing up in Clarkston," he said. "I don't want to go back. I want to remember it the way it was."
