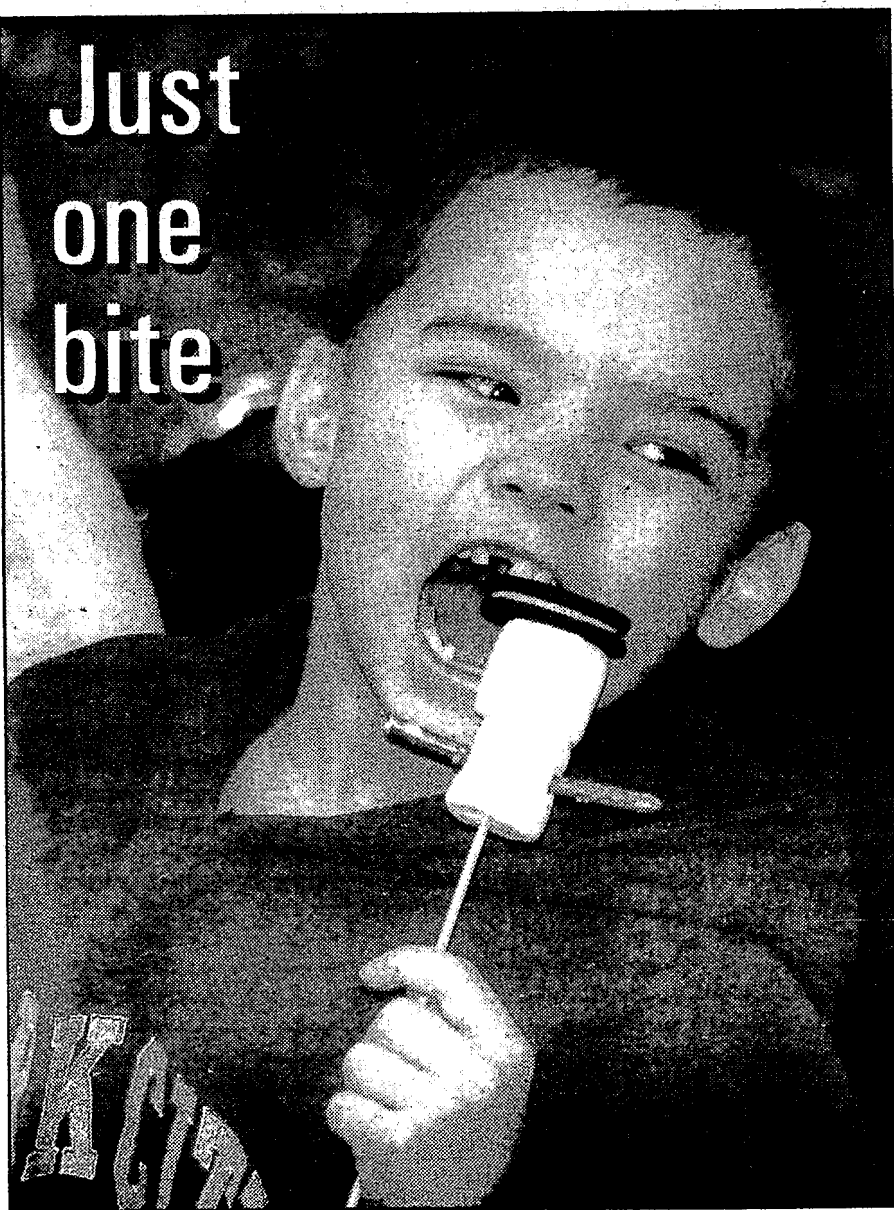

# Compromise

## Trustees, supervisor meet in the middle on budget numbers

It was give and take Monday night as Independence Township Trustees came to a budget compromise.

The budget passed, 5-2, Supervisor Dave Wagner and Treasurer Curt Carson voting against. The 2010 general fund, \$5,021,970, has a surplus of \$10,992.

The compromise combines Wagner's recommended budget with Trustee David Lohmeier's service-focused budget.

Wagner sought \$65,720 more than Lohmeier's budget for the supervisor's office, \$70,780 for assessing, and \$65,000 for building department.

Lohmeier budget sought \$95,000 more than Wagner's for Parks and Recreation, \$10,795 for the township board, \$4,000 for legal, and \$18,200 for the clerk's office.

In the compromise deal, township board and fund assessing went Wagner's way, while clerk, building, and parks and rec were in Lohmeier's budget favor. The approved budget meets in the middle on legal and

## Substation funds OK'd, just in case

As the new year begins, the idea for a new Oakland County Sheriff's substation in Springfield Township lives on.

The project isn't yet a go, but the Township Board approved \$29,500 in contingency funds. The substation is one possible use for it.

"I believe it would be a worthwhile endeavor," said Supervisor Mike Trout at the November township meeting. "It's a good deal. I'm not suggesting we rush in and make a commitment, but I think should leave

it in the budget. We can always make changes."

The \$54,000 proposal includes adapting 1,532 square feet in Springfield Township Fire

Department's Dixie Highway station for police. It would replace deputies' substation in Colombiere Center on Big Lake Road.

The township should continue to seek additional

funding, such as donations, and check its police fund balance after the spring budget audit before proceeding further, said Trustee Dennis Vallad.

"If it turns out it's unfundable, we just don't do the project," Vallad said. "Let's keep pursuing the goal. It's something necessary - it's been necessary for some time."

With state-shared and tax revenue falling, the township should hold off on the project at least a year, said Treasurer Jamie Dubre.

"We need to plan more," Dubre said. "We need to know what our funds are to do it. It took a long time for the civic center and fire

## Township, Comcast resolve fee dispute

After nearly three years of back and forth and a loss of \$300,000 in revenue, Comcast agreed to pay two-percent Public, Education, and Government, PEG, fees to Independence Township.

"I want to thank our local newspaper (Clarkston News), which wrote a story talking about how long this dispute has been going on," said Trustee David Lohmeier. "Frankly, as a new board member I didn't realize it."

Lohmeier, Treasurer Curt Carson, Secrest Wardle Attorney Kristin Kolb, and Clarkston Public Access Center Program Director Andy Reish met with Leslie Brogan, senior director of Government Affairs for Comcast, and Olivia Visperas, government affairs manager for Comcast, on Nov. 20 to resolve the issue prior to meeting with Michigan Public Service Commission.

"We tried to put aside everything we were arguing about, which included such dramatic issues as who filled out what blank, what date papers were filed, did somebody make the deadline, etc.," Lohmeier said.

The last offer by Comcast for PEG fees was a half percent. Lohmeier said the offer was based on a Community Needs

Assessment in California, which included about \$300,000 in equipment replacements.

"Comcast looked across the table and said to us 'that literally represents about a half of a percent and we don't see justification for more than that,'" he said. "We said we'll go back and we'll show you how we can spend the amount of money we're looking for, which is about \$160,000 a year, over 10 years about \$1.6 million."

Over the next two weeks, Reish analyzed cable studio and equipment, as well as Clarkston Schools' equipment. They met with Comcast again on Dec. 4, at which they agreed to two-percent PEG fees starting in January.

Trustee Neil Wallace said Lohmeier's accomplishment in the two meetings was "borderline magic."

"The PEG fees aren't exactly a windfall because they are going to go out to the citizens as an additional charge," Wallace said. "I would like to see us look at ways to monitor very closely what these expenditures will be."

Trustee Mark Petterson said he could not vote in favor of the PEG fees because it was "another tax" on residents.

"I'm looking at that as a punishment to the Comcast users in our township,"

Petterson said. "I realize the township needs money, but I don't see any way we can possibly charge our Comcast users then take that money."

Township Attorney Steve Joppich said it would not be considered a tax.

"A tax is paid by all residents," he said. "This is a fee for a specific service."

Carson said PEG fees were designed for users who get something for them.

"If in fact they don't want the additional benefit that is going to come from these fees, they can of course elect to cancel their service," he said. "This board has done a great job at increasing the number of people who watch cable television. I think it's all worthwhile."

Carson also thanked Lohmeier for a "fine job."

Lohmeier said Comcast would not pay PEG fees retroactively, and they could only be used for capital costs.

The board voted 6-1 to modify the franchise agreement to include two percent PEG fees. Petterson voted "no."

"We're really happy we reached the agreement," said Patrick Paterno, director of communications for Comcast. "We're looking forward to continuing our long lasting working relationship with the township."

# 'Paperless' agenda moves forward Data stored electronically

Independence Township Clerk Shelagh VanderVeen said she will sleep better at night knowing township records are safe, electronically.

"That was one of the concerns and has been an ongoing one for me ever since I was elected," she said. "What if, God forbid, this building should burn down or we had a flood or some type of catastrophe and all of our documents were lost?"

The board voted unanimously Dec. 15 to approve a record retention program, with setup cost of \$400, \$300 monthly, and \$40 a month for five gigabytes of storage. DSS Corporation of Southfield hosts the web-based program.

"They're the ones who back up our documents and ensure they are safe. They have them in two different locations so there is a redundancy," VanderVeen said. "The beauty with this is that it's a month-to-month lease, we are not locked into any long term lease."

Jim Hopkinson from DSS performed a "needs analysis" about two years ago, talking to department directors about work flow and ways to simplify tasks as well as eliminate paper-based processes.

"That's Jim's mantra, 'use the data not the paper,'" she said. "That's what he says all the time and that's what we want to do."

VanderVeen said they had a good start when they went to the "paperless agenda" almost three years ago.

"There is a mindset with the people of 'oh, let me make a copy of that for you' instead of 'I'll forward it to you or I'll e-mail it to you,'" she said. "Those kinds of things I'd like to get away from."

Project Manager Rita Heady said they will never be able to go "completely paperless" because of the requirement by

law to keep original signed documents.

"We'll have one original copy with a copy retained on the system so if somebody needs to use it to access it for whatever reason, they can," she said. "The original (paper copy) can be put away and archived."

As a web-based system, VanderVeen said everyone who works for the township will have access to all files.

"It's not a big electronic file cabinet. It's more than that. It's moving documents throughout departments and having access," she said. "Say the treasurer's department needs to see a purchase order, he (Treasurer Curt Carson) doesn't have to come down and say to the accounts payable clerk 'I need to see this.' He'll have access to that electronic file."

VanderVeen and Heady said they hope to bring the retention program "in-house" at some point in the future, but the cost would be \$50,000-\$60,000.

"With budget constraints, we were trying to come up with a way that made good use of township monies, without having to bring on added hardware or man-hours," Heady said.

VanderVeen said DSS will start training in early January. They will start with the clerk, finance, treasurer and assessing departments.

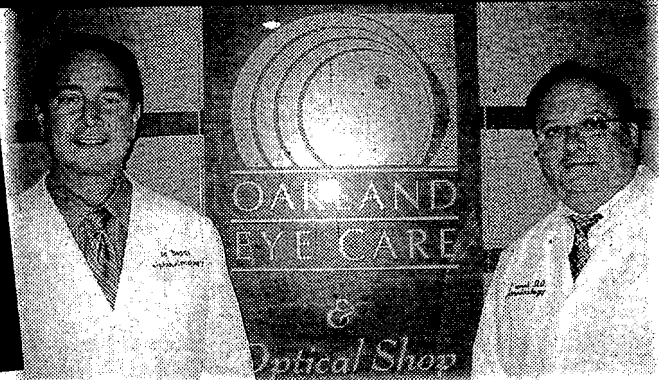

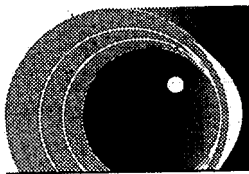

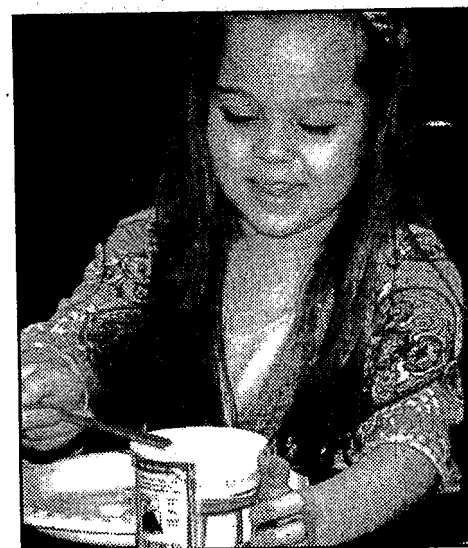
## HOLIDAY FUNFEST

They also enjoyed delicious treats - balancing between sugary and healthy.

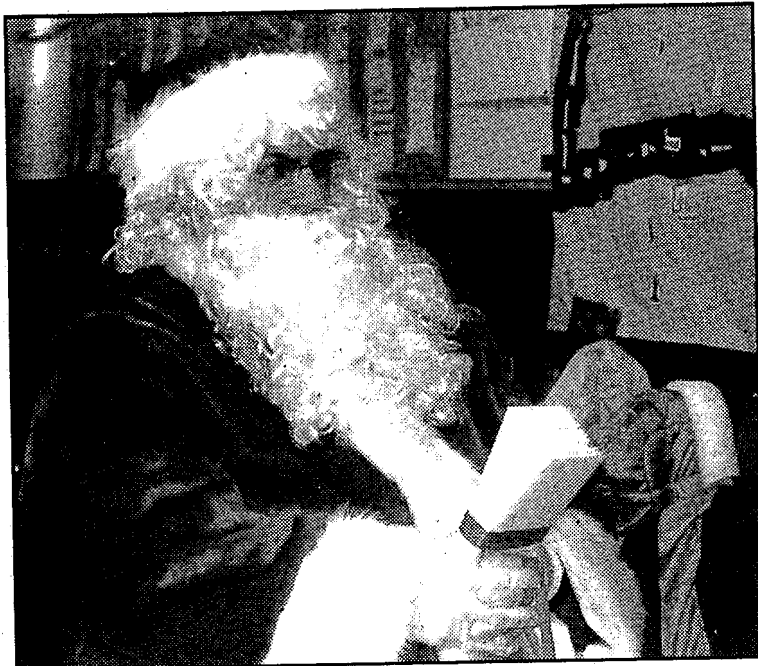

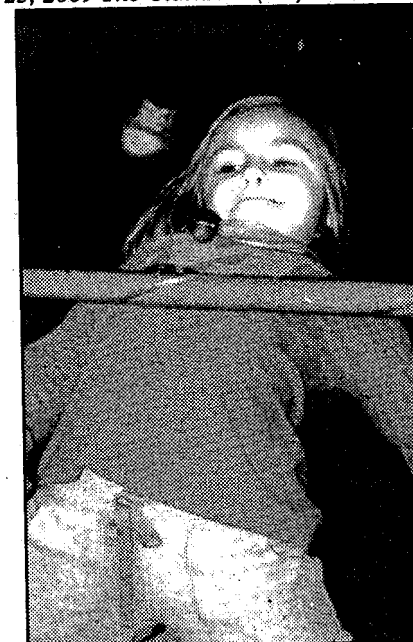

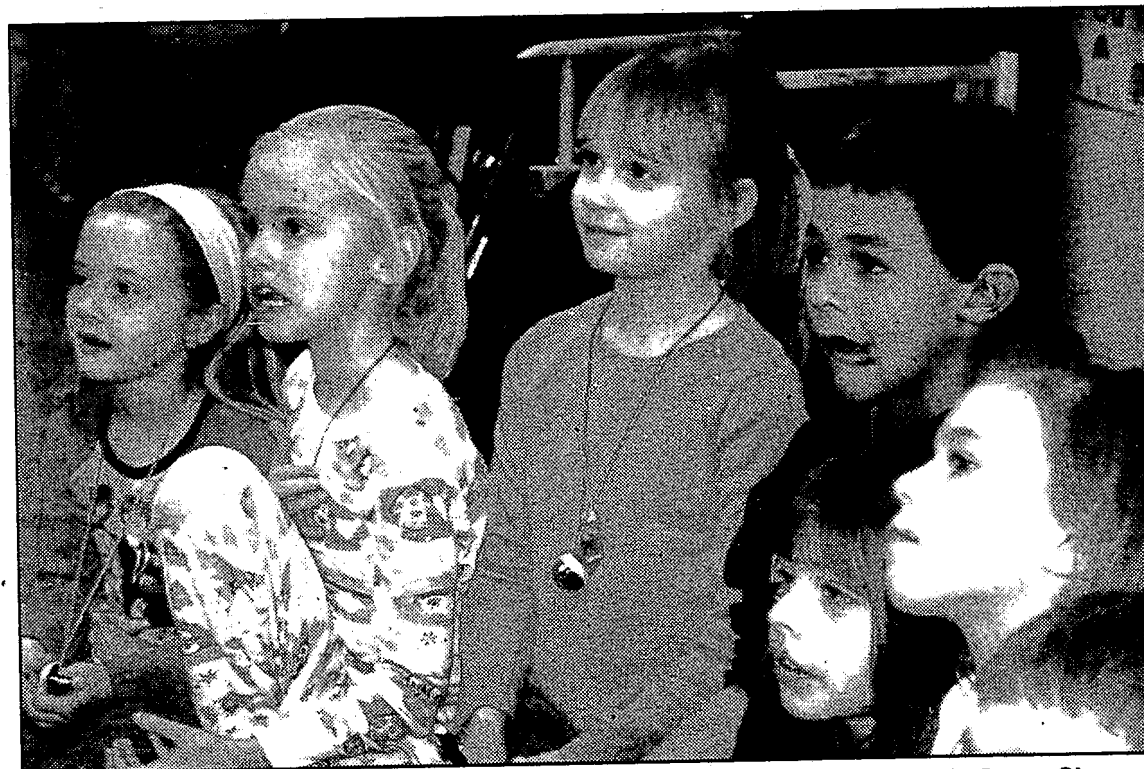

The mural sits unfinished, a travesty of squalor, with half-painted people and dogs without collars. And as I heard the town exclaim as she vanished from sight, Merry Christmas to all, but that mural still bites.

### 50 years ago - 1959

**"Special Services at Christ Lutheran"** Two Festive Christmas Eve Candlelighting Services climaxed the celebration of the Birth of Christ at Christ Lutheran Church. Christmas anthems were sung by four choirs of the Church, under the direction of Mrs. John Wiley.

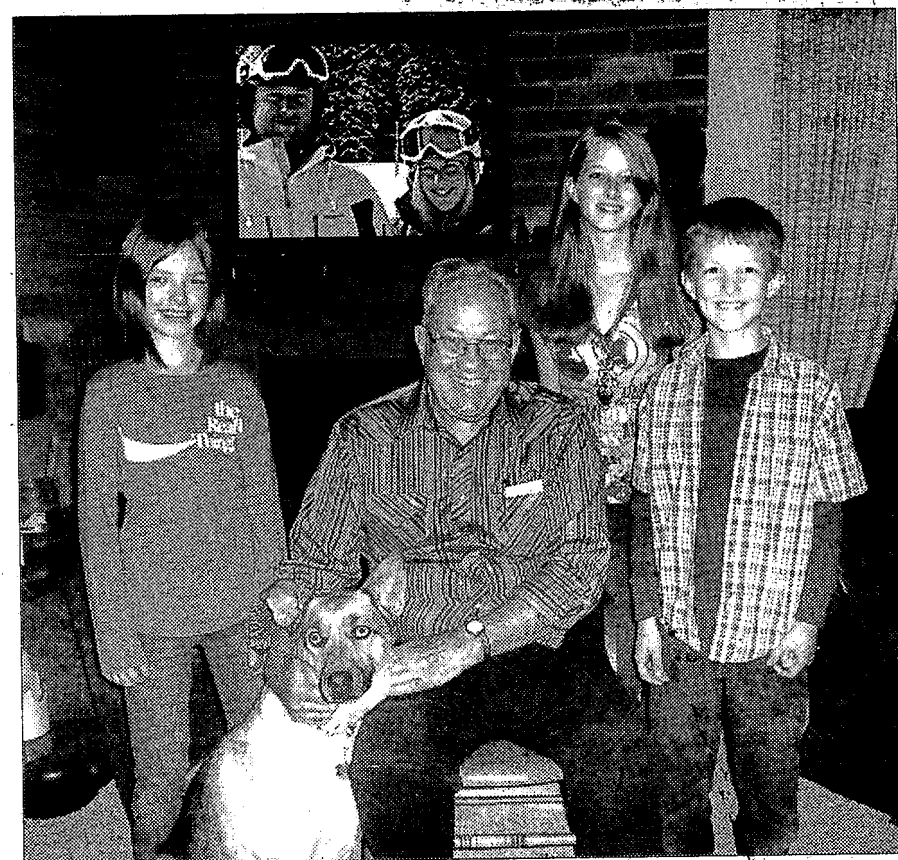

# Wolves sweep week before break

Matt Kamieniecki moved in closer to the basket as Carman-Ainsworth defenders maneuvered around to block the 6'7" senior.

Kamieniecki eyed the basket as Clarkston led the game by one point and the game would be over in less than three minutes. He took aim and let the ball go, watching as it made it's way through the basket.

He led the team, scoring 24 points in the 55-52 win over Carman-Ainsworth (2-1) on Dec. 16.

"We played a lot harder, a lot tougher and a lot better defense," said Jordan Clark, following the game. "We played more Clarkston basketball than last week (in the loss to Henry Ford, 55-54)."

Longtime Wolves Coach Dan Fife was proud of the boys game performance.

"It was a night and day difference between the team tonight compared to the night against Henry Ford. It just wasn't the same team."

Fife said key factors during the night was the effort the Wolves brought to the floor and communication.

"We got a much better effort from all 14 kids tonight and a much better effort in practice. I don't like to practice effort, and that's what we had to get back to was effort."

Not only was it the effort from the team, but two of his starters as well.

"Scarlett had a good effort, but Kami had to bring the effort mentally and physically," Fife pointed out. "He shot the ball well outside, which is good, but I was more pleased with his effort and how he got open offensively and that's what I want."

Another key was communication on the defensive end.

"Zach Collins came in and did a great job for us because he talks so much," Fife said. "He helps to settle people down by communicating. It's leadership that becomes an extension of me out there on the floor.

He is a sophomore who hasn't had any varsity experience and there he is - stepping in. He does the same thing for the football team."

Sophomore Nick Tatu put the boys into the lead scoring behind the 3-point line after Ainsworth scored two points. Tyler Scarlett, Kamieniecki and Tatu scored on four more 3-pointers before the first quarter ended, 19-12.

By the time game reached the half-time break, Ainsworth had caught up to Clarkston's momentum and were one point behind on the scoreboard, 26-25.

Tatu and Kamieniecki scored three field goals during the game, Marcus Hardy on two and Scarlett on one.

"Tatu is a shooter and he was a 3-point shooter last year," said Fife. "He can make that shot."

Tatu added a total of 16 points to the board and Scarlett, 9.

The boys followed it taking down Troy on Friday, 56-52, knowing the league game was going to

be tough.

"They don't like us that much," Clark said before the game. "So we have to come out and play hard and aggressive Clarkston basketball, like we did against Carman-Ainsworth."

The boys finished the first half trailing three points behind the Colts, 27-24.

Clarkston's defense kept Troy down to 16 points

Kamieniecki was the leading scorer with 22 points and Scarlett added 12 to the board.

Troy was led by James Young. He scored 23 points during the game.

The boys head into the holiday break and make their return to the floor on January 5, when they host Pontiac High School.

"We can work on what we need to work on," said Fife, taking advantage of the two-week break. "We are still young and hopefully we don't take backward steps or sideways steps. We want to keep going forward."

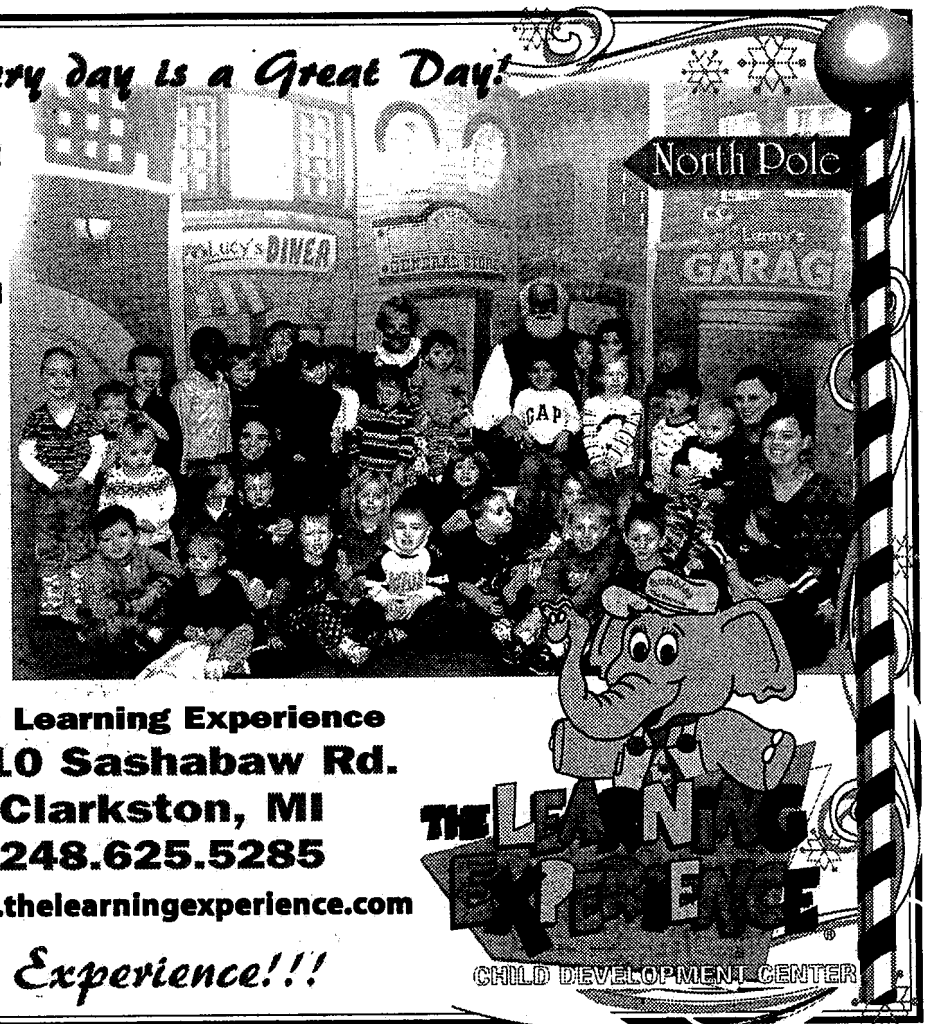

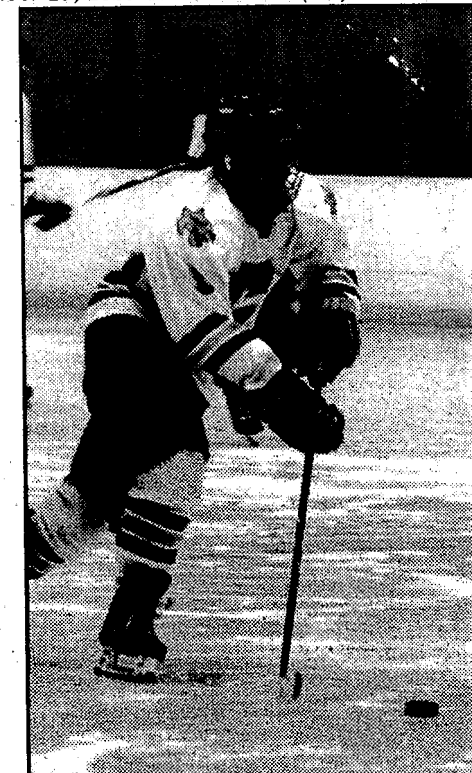

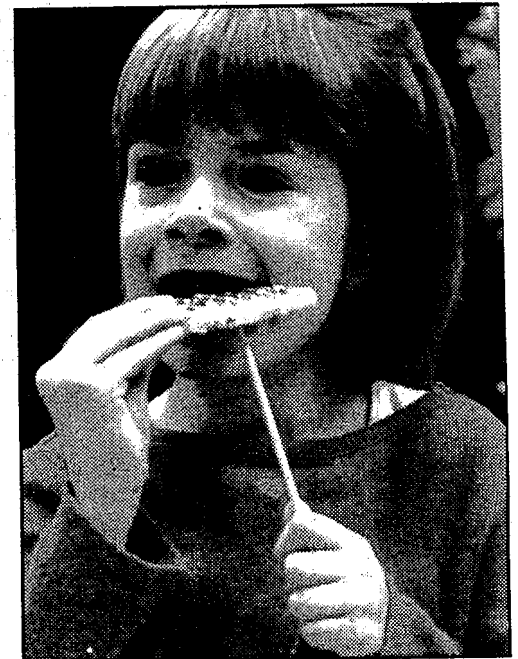

## New budget saves parks programs

supervisor's budget.

"We have a lot of differences at this table, but I believe I speak for everybody up here when I say I'd just as soon not cut anything," Lohmeier said. "We're just all trying to do it in the fairest way and there is a difference on what 'fair' is."

The approved budget means cutting staff in the building department to three people, as well as clerical staff in assessing, treasury, and clerk.

Trustee Neil Wallace said the building department's funding of \$453,100, as suggested by Lohmeier, "fits the actual level of services required by the township."

Trustee Mark Petterson was worried about going "too far too quickly."

"I think the supervisor's budget tonight adequately reflects where we should be for now," he said. "We can change these numbers anytime we want - we're the board."

He was also worried about making the building department "inoperable."

"Crush building department down to three people? It will not be able to operate on three people," Petterson said.

Wagner agreed and suggested looking at the department in upcoming months to see if it would be the right thing to do. The

budget would also save some parks and rec programs and keep Deer Lake Beach open.

Treasurer Curt Carson voted against the compromise because parks and rec funding was too high.

"Since the original budget that has come out, we've worked tirelessly at every turn to put more money into parks and rec," he said. "I think the information I provided tonight shows it's more than well funded and I can't vote to give up one employee just for programs that are nonessential."

Petterson also had a hard time adding \$95,000 to parks and rec.

"I enjoy the programs and so does a lot of other people, but a lot of those are one day programs," he said. "I don't think this \$95,000 is going to make them or break them."

Clerk Shelagh VanderVeen said she is giving up more than other departments and was an "innocent lamb being led to the slaughter."

"I don't want any part of this, it stinks and is not doing any of our citizens any service, none whatsoever," she said referring to the supervisor's budget. "Why don't we put the money in the departments that need it, that actually perform? I've been looking for an exit strategy and I hope it's not this one."

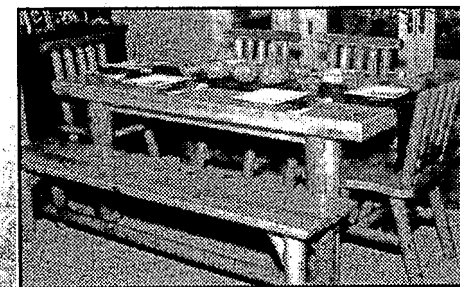

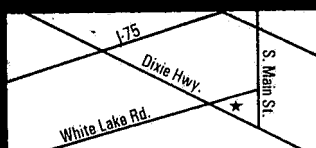

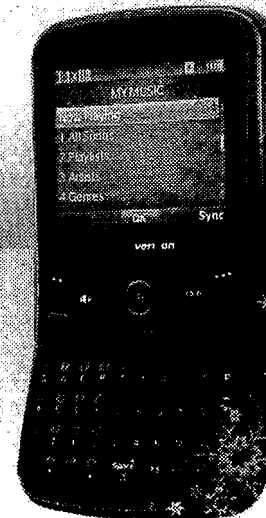

## Bethlehem shows how Christmas is for all

Where we are born establishes the course of the rest of our life.

Three babies born in Clarkston, Baghdad, and Nairobi will have somewhat different paths to follow. None are automatically better than the others. Other factors such as the health of the family, social environment and economic standing will affect their life path.

What they believe about themselves, the world and who they worship shape them as a person. Our first defining moments however, begin with where we were born.

Why was Jesus born in Bethlehem? Bethlehem was the place where King David was born.

He was the greatest of all the kings of Israel. Like all of us, he was less than perfect. His sins were public for all the world to see. Yet as low as his sins brought him, his faith placed him in places where God's providence and grace were made known.

How much better than, for one who was sinless and would bring in the Kingdom of God, to be born in the place of David's birth?

Christian Biblical scholars point to a passage in the book of Micah. They interpret Micah 5:2 ("But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel,

whose origins are from of old, from ancient times") as referring to the place where the Messiah was born. So it makes sense to them Jesus was born in Bethlehem.

These are some of the reasons why Jesus was born in Bethlehem.

Perhaps more important is where Bethlehem is and what it became. Bethlehem is five miles outside of Jerusalem. It was "in the country." God intentionally chose to have his Son be born not in a place of power. Instead the common and ordinary was chosen. Stable smells and manger hay was chosen over cologne and silk. If Christmas first came to a place such as that, then it can come anywhere now.

For that night, Bethlehem became the center of the world where shepherds, sojourners, and eventually wise men would gather. Bethlehem became where all were welcomed and important.

Why Bethlehem? Perhaps it was so wherever we are this Christmas, we know Christmas can come there. Christmas can come to our home, community, family, hurts and hopes. Christmas can come even to us where there is no peace or hope and make both possible.

Christmas began in a place where we would know the only thing that made it possible was God's grace. That is still true today. Merry Christmas and may the peace of this new born King come to you wherever you are!



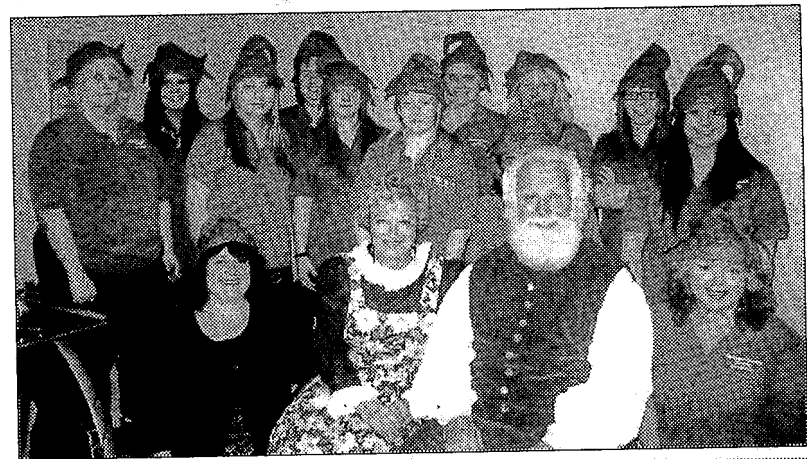

The applicant shall also submit plans to any County, State or Federal agencies having jurisdiction and request that a copy of their review comments for compliance with agency rules, policies or laws be forwarded to the Clerk. A copy of the transmittal letter forwarding plans to the agencies shall be included with the Technical Review application information submitted to the Clerk.

- The Clerk shall forward copies of the plans, documents and checklist review to the Planner and Engineer for review.
- The Planner and Engineer shall review the plans and other information submitted for compliance with applicable ordinances, policies, laws and standards and shall furnish written comments, opinions and recommendations to the Clerk, the applicant and the applicant's plan preparer.
- After the Clerk receives written responses from the Planner and Engineer, the plan may be submitted to the Planning Commission for review.
- Any plan revised in response to comments from the Engineer, Planner or agencies having jurisdiction shall not be placed on a Planning Commission agenda until written comments on the revision have been received by the Clerk.

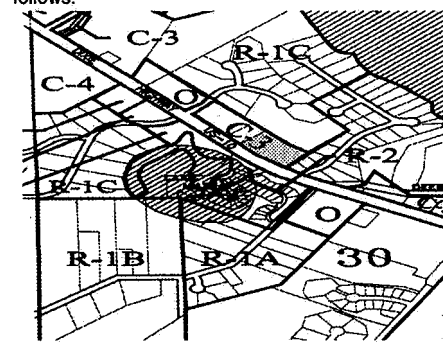

station – we should go to the tax payers. If they want it, I'd be all for it."

A new substation would be more accessible and visible to the public than Colombiere. Also, the current substation abusers treatment center, which causes privacy and security issues for deputies and residents coming in to file reports, said Oakland County Undersheriff Mike McCabe to trustees.

"It's not the greatest location," McCabe said. "Co-locating with the fire department would have a lot of pluses – I see this as a win for you and a win for us."

Non-violent jail inmates could provide free labor, with the county obtaining all permits and inspections, he said.

"It would be a first-class operation," he said.

The substation issue and expected losses in state-shared funding were the most significant points of discussion on the township's 2010 budget, which was approved unanimously, Nov. 12.

Dubre said she expects next year's state revenues to fall by about \$25,000.

"State share, tax revenues, and fund balances are all declining," she said.

"I expect a 10 percent decrease in revenues for the next couple of years at least," Trout said. "We're looking for ways to be more efficient – that's the key."

According to the 2010 budget, property tax revenue is expected to fall from \$685,000 in 2009 to \$640,000, with \$600,000 estimated in 2011. State-shared revenue falls from \$880,000 budget in 2009 to \$800,000 in 2010, with \$750,000 estimated for 2011. Township board voted unanimously, Dec. 3, to freeze salaries for elected officials for 2010.
