# Market marks summer start

The parking lot was packed behind Clarkston Mills Mall, Saturday, as people from all over enjoyed the start of summer with Clarkston Farmers' Market.

"Today we have about 30 vendors, which is really good for this part of the season because there isn't a lot that's ready in Michigan now," said Market Manager Anissa Howard on Saturday.

Vendors sold fresh cut flowers and potted plants, strawberries, garlic tops, homemade sauces and noodles, Alpaca and Llama fibers, organic coffee eggs, and other items. The market also hosted professional photographers and a masseuse.

"An orchard came and they wanted to come back and do cider slushies, and in the cold months they'll bring hot cider and drinks," Howard said.

Market volunteer Joe Wauldron said they started off last year with around 12 vendors and had maxed out the summer with 45.

"Last year at the beginning of the market we tried to do a little flower show. It didn't excite anybody, so this year we just tried to just throw it out there and see what happens. Look what happened," he said. "We got a good, good turnout."

The market is open Saturdays from 8 a.m. to noon.

# Suspects sought in armed robberies

Investigation continues into two armed robberies in Independence Township, both happening the same morning.

At 9:50 a.m., June 14, a suspect approached a clerk at the Sunoco gas station on M-15 north of I-75, saying he had a bomb in his pocket.

"That's the first use of a bomb threat in a robbery that I've heard of," said Det. Sgt. Matt Baldes, Independence Township Substation, Oakland County Sheriff's Office.

The suspect is described as a 25-30 year old man, white, about 6-feet-tall, wearing a white shirt with blue and yellow stripes and plaid shorts, beige fedora hat with dark-colored hat band. He fled north on foot. A sheriff K-9 unit tracked the suspect for about 100 yards, ending at Amy Drive were it appeared the suspect got into a vehicle.

Security video from the gas station is being reviewed, and investigation continues.

A hour-and-a-half after that robbery, two boys, 12 and 14, were reportedly approached by an armed robber at Bridgewater Apartments, at Sashabaw and Maybee Roads.

They were heading to McDonalds at 11:20 a.m.

June 14, when they were approached by a man in his mid 20s, 6-foot-2-inches, Black or Hispanic, with scraggy beard, possibly a mustache, black dress shoes, black dress pants, and a black hoodie.

He said he had a gun and threatened to shoot them, and took a cell phone and cash. A witness saw the boys running away, called police, and tried unsuccessfully to find the suspect. A sheriff K-9 unit tracked the suspect but lost the scent in the parking lot in the southwest end of the

gas station robbery. apartment complex.

"It's an unusual thing, to rob two kids," Baldes said. "We're looking into a few







# Clean slate in store for former lumberyard

The former lumberyard in downtown Davisburg is set to be cleared of all structures


"The structure is ready to collapse – I'm glad we took it over," said Springfield Township Clerk Laura Moreau. "It's in everyone's best interest."

The Township Board contracted with Rogers Excavating of Springfield Township to demolish all four buildings at the site, Broadway and Andersonville roads, and remove foundations and concrete pads, cost not to exceed \$12,000.

"Make it a clean slate, remove everything so it will be safe," said township Supervisor Mike Trout. "That's the best approach, with the most flexibility."

The township is looking into a new community septic system at the location, with a preliminary design this fall, Trout said.

"A new septic system would allow down-



The abandoned structures at Broadway and Andersonville Roads in Davisburg are all set for demolition. File photo


town businesses access to a fully functional system, improving their business," he said.

The system, possibly funded by a special assessment, would include collection pipes, treatment system, and septic field, he said.

"There are a lot of different types of treatment system – we're looking at several," he said. "We're in the preliminary phase, and aren't looking to move fast. The system's failing, though, so the sooner we do it, the better off we'll be."

The township purchased the 3.3 acre property this past March for \$125,000.





More than 200 Girl Scouts and counselors filled Independence Oaks Count Park for day camp fun.


With an Under the Sea theme, the scouts enjoyed archery, boating, swimming, and crafts at the Pleasant Ridge Day Camp, June 14-17.

## Hoping for best in school search

Right at the beginning of Clarkston's search for a new superintendent, and some signs are less than encouraging.

Reporter Wendi Reardon sent an e-mail to school board members asking about the timeline for the search, and what they want in a superintendent.

These aren't difficult questions. I. for-

one, would look for a slavish devotion to education, open communication, and common sense, with a can-do, nowhining attitude.

I expected our e-mail box to be filled with trustees' insightful re-

sponses. What we received was one e-mail from board President Steve Hyer.

And it seemed a bit testy.

"You were at the meeting when we discussed this," he wrote.

Wendi brought up the possiblity of sharing the job search with Waterford School District to save costs, which is also looking for a superintendent. Hyer dismissed it.

"The Board of Education expressed great interest in being very serious about this process to find the right individual for Clarkston," he said. "We want to make this a long term appointment and not a quick fix. We are confident the process we will be firming up will be an excellent process yielding excellent results in providing us with a superintendent that can innovatively lead us into the future."

This is not a good sign.

Too much about "process." And don't voters elect the school board to "lead us into the future?"

This response, and the lack of others, indicates trustees are holding their cards close. A debate is coming over what kind of chief administrator Clarkston gets next one exactly the same, or something new.

In a discussion on the Clarkston News' Facebook page, a commentator pointed out Austin Intermediate School District spent \$192,000 on a superintendent search ("Holey buckets!" we replied). They paid a search fee of \$42,000. but then an additional \$150,000 in legal fees to fight open record lawsuits associated with the hire of our new superinten-







Wauldron said they would have over 500 people come through the market, which is good for opening day. The average is around 1,200-1,500, but they have had a high of 2,000.

"If anyone wants to see what the market is like, we're running a CPAC PSA (Clarkston Public Access Center Public Service Announcement) on channel 10 and 20," he said. "It's short blurb about the market itself from last year.

Howard also said the "Radio Flyer" wagons are for shoppers to use especially when heavier items such as watermelons and cantaloupes come in. She also said dogs are allowed in the market, but farmers have asked the dogs not be brought in the booths or allowed near the food.

Wauldron noted it's a political season, too, but they are asking politicians to keep to the parking lot.

"If people want to come in and do their bit with their political signs and stuff like that they need to be off in the parking lot some place passing out the literature," he said. "They cannot come into the market trying to support themselves for votes."

At last year's market, they also collected

Like the Olympics. the State Games of Michigan will have a Parade of Athletes, Lighting of the Cauldron and experience great entertainment.


The opening ceremony is Friday at 7 p.m.






The girls defeated four teams during the tournament for the 16-Open Division held at DeVos Center in Grand Rapids, June 5-6.





# Volunteers help family rebuild

Nothing can replace a husband and father, killed in the line of duty in Iraq. But people can help.

"It's amazing what can be accomplished in one day," said Patricia Peterson, "Patty," of Independence Township. "We have a nice, safe deck to walk on, and enjoy the summer on."

Employees from BAE Systems' facility in Sterling Heights, local contractors, and home improvement companies all volunteered time and materials to rebuild the Peterson family's backyard deck, June 17.

This is an opportunity to help someone out who lost a significant other in battle," said Scott E. Rutter, Strategic Programs director for BAE Systems' U.S. Combat Systems. "The employees here are all volunteering their own time."

Patricia's husband, Marine Capt. Justin Peterson, was a supply officer with 1st Tank Battalion, 1st Marine Division, on his first deployment to Iraq. He was killed in a vehicle crash, Oct. 1, 2006, in Al Anbar Province.


For a while, Patty handled things mostly by herself. That lasted about two years.

"My son started saying, 'I miss dad," she said. "That's something I'm not really equipped to deal with. I was looking for something to help with the kids.'

Jayden, 6, and sister Caitlin, 4, are too young to remember their father - what they know about him comes from their mother, as well as photographs and videos. But they see friends and classmates in school with their dads and know something's missing, Patty said.

She turned to Tragedy Assistance Program for Survivors, or TAPS, a nonprofit veterans service organization based in Washington, D.C.

"It's very good for all of us," she said. "They reach out to help as many groups as possible, and they do it well - wives, husbands, children,

parents, aunts, uncles. They have one support group just for fiancés.'

BAE Systems, a global defense, security and aerospace company, works with TAPS to arrange service projects for local families.

"BAE Systems has a deep-rooted and corporate-wide philosophy of giving back to the communities where our employees live and work," said Joe McCarthy, vice president and general manager of Heavy Brigade Combat Team Systems for BAE Systems. "We are honored Patty agreed to let us build a new deck for her and her children."

They contacted Patty this past February.





ured out this project," she said. "The workers have been great — their generosity has had such a tremendous impact on our family and others. My children and I are so grateful."

The Petersons previously lived at the Marine base in southern California. Patty, pregnant with Caitlin, and Jayden moved back to Michigan when Justin's unit deployed.

"He wanted me to stay with my parents (Ken and Sherry Goss of Independence Township) while he was gone," Patty said. "We've stayed in the area ever since."

She and the children recently moved into a house in Independence Township, where they are still adapting to life without Justin.

"All the little things he used to do, those become bigger," Patty said. "My Christmas and birthday lists for my parents, and brother and sister are to-do lists, not presents. The kids and I learning to live our new life. It's not what I thought I'd be doing, but I'm doing what I have to."

She attends regional TAPS seminars, participated in the Marine Corps marathon and volunteered at the 2010 National Military Widow Seminar. Most recently, she enrolled in the TAPS Peer Mentor program to sup-

port newly bereaved military family mem-

"They connect people with shared experiences, so you don't feel out there by yourself. It's a very good thing," she said



"There are a lot of survivors out there—children, parents, siblings," said Rutter, retired lieutenant colonel in the U.S. Army and TAPS volunteer. "We reach out to local communities and work together to help them build a new life."

Justin joined the Marines in 1992, serving in the reserves while in college, then active duty as an officer.

"Justin always wanted to be in the Marine Corps – when I met him at 17 years old, he'd already signed his enlistment papers," Patty said. "That was who he was, what he wanted to do. He was one of those people who knew what he wanted to do and had fun getting there."

Abba, on the other hand, is a relational word. Today we might translate it with the word "daddy". God wants us to remember that He has established an important relationship with us.

We, the prodigal, the rebellious children, are made one with Him, are made heirs of His Heavenly Kingdom. This comes to us through Jesus' loving act — dying on the cross and rising from dead to defeat death and the



# Helping the library grow


Since May, the Independence Township Public Library has looked a little different - new plants cover Peter Rabbit's garden near the main entrance.

With over 500 shoppers in a day and 30 vendors, Clarkston Farmers' Market proved once again to be a hit for its sixth season in a




