# New place for market


Additionally, there is more parking and indoor bathrooms. Howard also said the high school has a registered kitchen and, in the future, the market may be able to use the facilities to offer programming for kids to go along with the market.

# Frack opponents speak out

Tim Heming of Clarkston gathered over 300 signatures to ban horizontal hydraulic fracturing (fracking) in Michigan.

"The prime reason I'm concerned about this is my three grandchildren. I don't want to leave them something they have to clean up," said Heming, who has been learning about oil and gas drilling while studying sustainable architecture at Oakland Com-

The signatures are on a petition to amend the Michigan Constitution to ban fracking statewide.

The township also shouldn't be able to "legislate laws into action that dictate how my water will be handled by a corporation or a company," said Heming, who joined

the Ban Michigan Fracking movement.

The Independence Township Board heard from two county residents on the subject of oil and gas exploration, June 5.

Joe Curry of Holly, director of the Michigan Groundwater Association and a member of the Water Systems Council, said Michigan's water systems are intercon-

"A person in this state is never more than six miles from a natural water source or more than 85 miles from a great lake shoreline," Curry said. "Our underground aquifers, surface waters, and Great Lakes are connected."

Fracking causes water contamination and air quality problems, he said.

Steve McPherson, a water well driller from White Lake Township, urged the board 'to err on the side of caution when it concerns our air, surface, and groundwater."

What we have here is a perfect storm of corporate front men selling small town politicians and uninformed individual landowners on a short sighted goal of extracting natural resources in a depressed economy," McPherson said.

In an auction in early May, Jordan Development oil and gas company from Traverse City purchased \$600,000 worth of mineral lease rights in Michigan.

Eleven of the mineral parcels are located in Independence Township, and some of those minerals are beneath Bay Court Park.

Chris Bickley, Jordan Development representative, insisted the company doesn't intend to use the controversial technique of hydraulic fracturing when he talked with the township board on May 15.

The company has 300 fracking wells, mostly in northern Michigan.

Horizontal "fracking" is a process of mineral extraction that pumps millions of gallons of water and chemicals into the earth's surface to fracture shale beds and release the natural gas trapped within.

# No change to open-burn ordinance this year

When Independence Township Board brought a revised open-burn ordinance up for first reading, June 5, residents pushed back

According to the revised version, fires can only be five feet in diameter. That's not enough for residents Mary Brower and Warren Nessbit, who live in rural areas, who said they use controlled burns to clear brush, dispose of fallen leaves, and avoid using sprays.

Martha Newstead pointed out residents who need to remove trees and leaves don't have many alternatives.

"If they can't dispose of them, they're going to end up in places where they shouldn't be," she said.

However, locals who don't live in rural areas like Neil Boggemos are concerned about the smoke.

On June 5, Boggemos's wife, who teaches at Clarkston Elementary, had to leave school and one of her students needed a breathing treatment because Clarkston United Methodist Church across the street was having a fire. The church had been issued a burn permit and their fire was contained, but the smoke was not.

From Boggemos's perspective, there

should be more burn limits on smaller properties where neighbors are closer to one another rather than holding citizens who have larger swathes of land in rural areas to the same standards. The revised ordinance restricts fires to a distance of at least 25 feet from a neighboring dwelling.

Currently, the township fire department hasn't issued any 2012 burn permits because of the pending revision of the Open Burning ordinance.

After almost two hours of discussion, the board voted unanimously to extend the 2011 burn permits to December 2012 and the ordinance did not receive its first reading.






Angelini agreed it was important to get to know growers and said buying at a local market is very important.

# No-Spice drive success

#### Effort continues on state restrictions

The Clarkston area is free of Spice/K2, thanks to a group of community volunteers.

"We are ecstatic about the support we've had from business owners and the people of Clarkston," said Lisa Barth, one of organizers of No Spice/K2 Clarkston. "We expected the community to come through but had no idea it would happen so quickly."

For the past several weeks, volunteers have been going to stores throughout Clarkston, and Independence and Springfield townships. They asked them not to sell Spice/ K2 synthetic drugs, and to sign a pledge not to do so. As of June 8, they all have.

The group published a list of participating merchants on its website, www.nospicek2clarkston.org, and Facebook

"I think people really responded to our approach of supporting the stores who take the pledge while increasing public awareness of the dangers of these products," said Andrea Schroeder, another founding member. "We wanted to take positive action to get a positive result."

The group has about 4-5 core members, with another dozen or so helping out. They used zoning maps to identify commercial zones and divide up territory for coverage.

"The majority were very receptive, but there was some push back – it's legal, there's a demand for it," Schroeder said. "Once we talk to the owners to make them aware of the negative impact this has on our community, the responsible ones sign the pledge."

Rich Walker, owner of Cracker Barrel market at Sashabaw and Oak Hill, signed he pledge on June 6.

"After looking into it, I have no problem signing the pledge. It's not a good product," Walker said. "I hope all stores agree not to sell it. I don't want my kids to do it – I think it should be banned."

His store never carried the product, he said.

"I didn't even know about it," he said. "It's like marijuana. I don't want to sell something like that. We're not that kind of store."

The No Spice group was launched on May 10 at a information forum hosted by 52-2 District Court Judge Kelley Kostin.

"I applaud NSK2C and the vendors who are taking the pledge for their efforts and hope that other communities follow suit," Kostin said. "This is exactly what the residents of Clarkston need to do in order to make the public aware of this dangerous substance."

The volunteers worked with community service organizations throughout the project, - and he said he had been smoking it.

said Tonya Cunningham, liaison with the Clarkston Coalition for Youth, a community partner.

"This is at the forefront of what we do – our mission is to help kids reach their highest potential. Harmful chemicals like this do not allow that," Cunningham said. "Working together, we were able to get the message out to more people, more efficiently."

With their success, they have been contacted to help with similar groups in Troy, Clawson, Oxford, Lake Orion, Rochester, Madison Heights, and Auburn Hills, as well as in Macomb County and Wayne County.

The pledge drive isn't the end of the project. Schroeder testified at a hearing in Lansing to get the state involved.

"Civic activism is piecemeal and unsustainable," she said. "We need comprehensive legislative solution around which local efforts can move."

State legislators are considering bills to prohibit the "designer drugs" by chemical classification, and empower state police to remove them from stores.

"These dangerous substances have already been linked to horrific crimes in our communities, and it is our job to help get these dangerous substances off the shelves," said state Rep. Eileen Kowall, whose district includes the Clarkston area.

"I also want to thank the local residents who have come together in a grassroots manner to get local gas stations and stores to stop selling these dangerous drugs," Kowall said. "By working together on this issue, we are protecting our communities and keeping local children safe."

The products contain synthetic chemicals including stimulants methylmethcathine and methylenedioxpyrovalerone.

They have been linked to violent behavior including homicide and suicide. On May 25, deputies cited an 18-year-old Independence Township man with disorderly conduct for threatening to shoot employees at DTE Music Theater. He didn't have a weapon, but a packet of K2 was in his pocket



The dam has been broken for about a year and the Clarkston Village Council sued Lehman in January to get the dam fixed before the heavy rains in spring and summer.



But, you'll have to read next week to find out how that went.



"The development of business corridors was productive, and parks and recreation is going well," he said, but Fortuna doesn't give credit to the current government. Instead, he believes the township's successes are "indicative of the people."

"I think the community would like a township leader that really has some ideas and can execute them," Fortuna said. "We have a gorgeous platform: this community. We can really develop things here."

"I really liked the coach and my sister, Kristen, ran at State her first year in college," Natalie said. "Visiting there felt like home to me so I picked Michigan State and I really wanted to go to a Division I school."

She plans to study pre-medicine with her dream becoming a surgeon. She admitted she may be a physical therapist.

"I like the medical field and liked learning about it in school," Natalie added. "I figured I would like going into medical. I also like helping people."







For the children's program, each child is given a reading log. In it, they record the





The Gathering Place joins the community with a mission to create church in people's living rooms.





The Clarkston Center for the Performing Arts (CCPA) hopes to get not only a free performance from The Detroit Symphony Orchestra (DSO) but also to watch the production in the Clarkston High School auditorium.

A performance from the DSO in our community will only be made possible through online votes, however. So far, the DSO has heard "a lot of good responses, but we need more," said Cory Johnston, chair of the CCPA's Development Committee. For the DTE Energy Foundation to present the DSO in Clarkston, the community must share their support via votes and comments on the www.dso.org site by June 14.

"This is another opportunity for our community to be a great place to live," said Joette Kunse, who took part in nominating Clarkston for the performance. "It would be so wonderful for all ages in the community, and many people probably don't get to Detroit" to see the DSO.

Johnston agrees and believes a DSO concert will "inspire people to participate" in more performing arts activities in the community.

To vote, check www.dso.org and remember to vote for Oakland County as well as leave a comment about why the DSO should perform in Clarkston. The winner of a free DSO performance will be announced on June 18.


