foreword

Profile 68 is a compendium of facts and figures.

A wealth of information has been assembled and carefully organized into four major subject matter areas. Data is provided under the titles of (1) the people; (2) the economy; (3) land development; and, (4) government and services. Among the many tables, Oakland County statistics are frequently provided with those of its sister counties in the three-county standard metropolitan statistical area (SMSA). Similarly, much of the data has been arranged to enable the user to compare Oakland with six adjoining counties in the region of southeastern Michigan.

A concerted effort has been made to include the information most frequently requested over the past years. The tables which appear in Profile 68 are but a small fraction of the data bank maintained by the Oakland County Planning Commission.

We welcome advice and suggestion that would lead to even better future editions of Profile. In the meantime we trust that Profile 68 will serve the interests of the many who are influencing the development of Oakland County.

introduction

In examining the rapid development of Oakland County's population several facts bear emphasis. First of all, within the state Oakland's population is second only to that of Wayne County which includes the City of Detroit. Secondly, between 1940 and 1960 the population of Oakland more than doubled, and is expected to double again by the year 1990: reaching the 1.6 million level. Finally, it is not inconceivable that in the year 1990 Oakland could have a population greater than that of the City of Detroit. At this time the communities of Farmington, Waterford, and Bloomfield townships and the City of Southfield will probably emerge as the population leaders.

Since 1940 net natural increase, i.e. the excess of births over deaths, has accounted for an ever-increasing share of the total growth of population. Over the same time span Oakland's birth rate per thousand population experienced a steady decline. Thus, it has been through the influx of people and the multiplication of families, more so than the creation of larger families, that the growth in population has been achieved.

In addition, Oakland County experienced a significant shift in the age composition of its population between 1940 and 1960; with the percentage of the population under fifteen years of age showing the greatest increase. By 1990 it is anticipated that this segment and the over sixty-five age group will have, respectively, doubled and tripled.

In 1960 Oakland County's citizenry over twenty-five years of age ranked second only to comparable populace of Washtenaw County with respect to median number of school years completed. However, if each county maintains, throughout this decade, the rate of growth experienced in the 1950's, by 1970 Oakland will emerge the leader. Further illustration of the emphasis of education in Oakland County is demonstrated by the fact that the equalized valuation of Oakland's school districts increased from \$1.8 billion in 1957 to more than three billion dollars in 1967.

Finally, at the start of this decade nearly sixty percent of the employed residents of Oakland worked within the county. As could be expected the manufacturing industry accounted for more than one-third of the total employed population. Of significance however, is the fact that of those employed an extremely high percentage could be broadly defined as professionals. This is reflected by the fact that within the seven county Detroit region Oakland's households have the highest effective buying income: with some forty-four percent of its families earning more than \$10,000 in 1966.







introduction

The period spanning from 1958 to 1966 saw overall employment in Oakland county, as measured by those jobs covered by the Michigan Employment Security Act, increase one-hundred percent. As might be expected the manufacturing sector forms the major portion of the economic structure of Oakland County: accounting for nearly one-half of the 195,000 job total in 1966. The relative importance of the automotive industry in Oakland is partially reflected by the fact that within this sector the transportation equipment category accounts for more than half the number of employees and taxable payrolls.

The significance of the contribution of retail trade to Oakland's economy is perhaps best illustrated by the fact that the county's retail sales reached the \$1.5 billion level in 1966. This represented a four-fold increase over the mark of 1950. Put in an areawide context, the county's share of the total sales of the Detroit SMSA climbed from eleven percent to twenty-two percent during this seventeen-year span.

In 1966 general merchandise, food, and automotive sales each accounted for approximately one-fifth of the county's total retail sales. Specifically, general merchandise sales increased ten-fold over the span from 1950 to 1966, reflecting, to a great degree, the introduction and development of Northland as a major regional shopping center. Concurrently, substantial gains in both employment and payrolls were recorded in the wholesale trade, service, and finance, insurance and real estate sectors. As could be expected the percentage of land devoted to farming has steadily decreased in Oakland as well as throughout the entire seven county Detroit Region.

Briefly, in 1966 the finance sector was characterized by two noteworthy facts. Initially, the total deposits of Oakland County's commercial banks exceeded for the first time the one billion dollar level: representing a five-fold climb from the level of 1950. Secondly, the county accounted for 37 percent of the total recorded mortgages in the Detroit SMSA; again, a far cry from its 1950 share of only 18 percent of the total.







introduction

Oakland County embraces some nine-hundred square miles of which presently 28 percent can be broadly defined as devoted to urban use. Lakes, ponds, rivers, and streams occupy four percent, while the remaining 68 percent is classified as agricultural or vacant land. It has recently been calculated that by 1990, when the population is slated to reach 1.6 million, urban development will embrace 54 percent of the county.

That we are well on our way to this plateau is demonstrated by the fact that between 1960 and the first eight months of 1967 some 12,000 acres, or nineteen square miles, were platted: an average of two and one-half square miles per year. Further reflecting this rapid and extensive development activity is the fact that the period from 1950 to 1966 saw Oakland's share of the authorized dwelling units of the Detroit SMSA steadily increase and, finally, in 1966 account for 38 percent of the total: the largest share within the three-county area. Of this total approximately 42 percent of the units authorized in 1966 were multifamily units. This trend continued through the first half of 1967, with multiples accounting for 44 percent of the total.

Since 1960 the major growth communities in Oakland County, as measured by new residential units, have maintained somewhat consistant leadership in that the city of Southfield coupled with Farmington and Bloomfield townships have repeatedly been the scenes of substantial subdivision activity.

The rate and quantity of supporting utilities supplied and consumed during a given period offer the observer still another measure of the impact of population and industrial growth. As noted earlier, between 1940 and 1960 Oakland experienced an explosion in population and industrial development. Concurrently, electricity consumption in Oakland County increased nearly eight-fold, while residential consumption mushroomed to a level ten times the pre World War II mark. The impact of the future county development is partially revealed by the fact that the Detroit Water System has projected a three-fold increase in Oakland's average daily demand for water by the year 2000.





introduction

In 1967 Oakland's equalized valuation topped, for the first time, the three billion dollar level; representing ten percent of the state total. Of the three billion total the twenty-four cities of Oakland County contribute nearly two-thirds, with townships and villages embracing the remainder. Although the city of Pontiac contributes by far the greatest share it is significant to point-up the fact that since 1960 the city of Southfield's equalized valuation increased 120 percent; to more than three-hundred million dollars.

Drawing heavily from this investment in Oakland County, the county government's revenue stood at the 30 million dollar level in 1966. This total represented a 50 percent increase over the level existing at the beginning of this decade. Of the total costs incurred by the county government in 1966, the largest share, some 45 percent, was devoted to health, welfare, and medical assistance programs. In all, there are today approximately seventy public and private hospital and medical facilities located in Oakland County serving its residents and neighbors.

With respect to higher education, the county embraces some thirteen colleges, universities, and institutes, with a combined enrollment of some 15,000 students. Serving these students and the balance of the populace are nearly forty public and private libraries which house approximately a million volumes.

Finally, and of general interest, is the fact that the county is serviced by four major daily newspapers, two of which are headquartered in the county. In all, the dailies have a combined circulation of 270,000, which is supplemented by nearly thirty weekly papers published and distributed within the county.


