

The death of a 15 year old Lake Orion youth is being investigated by the Oakland County Sheriff's Department.

Deputies were called to 777 Heights Road at 8:57 p.m. Feb. 7. Upon arrival they found Johnathan Roerink on his bedroom floor with a bullet wound to the head.

Following medical aid by officers and the ambulance company, Roerink was taken to Pontiac Osteopathic Hospital where he was pronounced dead at 9:53 p.m.

The youth's brother, James, was in possession of the weapon at the time of the shooting.

A spokesman for OCSD said the shooting may have been an accident, but an investigation is taking place.
