Mrs. Polly Sprague died ather home in this city, Monday morning, November 3, 1884. Polly Hawley was bern in Ontario Co., N. Y. in Feb. 1806. Married to Leonard Sprague by Rev. Samuel Steele, of East Bloomfield N. Y., March 1, 1827. In the same year came with her husband to Michigan and settled in the township of Troy. About sixteen years ago they moved to Pontine where she has over since residual. Fiftysthree years they lived together happy in the enjoyment of christian privileges and the practice of the christian virtues. Four years ago he preceded her to the Spirit Wordland

O er its mortal track, We cannot doubt that he was present when her spirit took its flight and passed with her through grory's morning gate to walk in Paradise. They had no children. About a year ago her sister, the last survivor of her family died in Wisconsin, and since then she has felt that she was almost alone in the wor'd and has expressed a desire to join her beloved husband and friends in the other world. She had always enjoyed excellent health until a short time before her death. In August last she made a short visit to Fentonvill. The heat and fatigue of the journey and visit brought on nervous prostration from which she never recovered. She was a sincere christian, a communicant of the protestan episcopal church and died in fall faith of a glorious resurrection through Christ.
