Oct 11 1882
 Last week Tuesday Mr. and Mrs. Charles Howlett removed the remains of their little daughter Lizzie (who died Aug. 4th), to Pontiac and interred them in Oak Hill cemetery.

Oct 18 1882
 Bruce, son of R. Stanlake, of this city, died last Wednesday morning, Oct. 11, of typhoid fever, aged sixteen years. Funeral services were held at Zion church Friday, sermon by Rev. L. S. Stevens, and the remains interred in Oak Hill cemetery. Bruce was an extraordinary young man in many respects, no better boy ever gladdened the home of fond parents, and his death is a terrible affliction to Mr. and Mrs. Stanlake. For the kind services of neighbors and friends, the family return grateful thanks.

 Mrs. Seely Lee died at the residence of her daughter Sunday afternoon, and was buried Tuesday forenoon from the M. E. church.

Oct 15 1882
 Last Friday night Geo. P. Smith fell or was shaken from the platform of a train near Novi, striking on his head, producing concussion of the brain from which he died Saturday.

Oct 25 1882
 Mrs. Mary Moon, of Waterford, who was so badly injured a few days since by being thrown from a buggy at Mr. Wyckoff's, died last Thursday night, after much pain and suffering, in her 81st year. Funeral services were held Sunday at the M. E. church, Waterford. Mrs. Moon came to Michigan in 1834, and with her husband settled on the farm now owned by D.V. Robbins. Silas Moon died in 1856, and since his widow has lived in Waterford. Mrs. M. was one of the first members of the Waterford Baptist church, and her sad death is mourned by many relatives and friends.

Mathew McCoy an old resident of this county died at his home near Walled Lake on Friday night last, aged 94 years. *Oct 25 1882*

Mrs. Sarah A. Rockwell, aged 77 died at her home in Pontiac Monday forenoon, of inflammation of the lungs. Funeral from the house at two o'clock this (Wednesday) afternoon. *Nov 1, 1882*
