Died, at the residence of his son-in-law, (O. F. Delano,) in North Oxford, June 27, 1883, Grandy Earl, aged 60 years, one month and sixteen days.

Grandy Earl was born in Eastown, Saratoga county, New York, May 11th, 1798. He was married to Polly White, of Broad Albany, Montgomery county, New York, February 9th, 1815. A few years after he moved to Wales, Erie county, in western New York. He came to Michigan in the summer of 1888, spent the first winter in Southfield, this county. The following spring he moved to Oxford, settled on a farm, residing in the township or settled on a farm, residing in the township or village of Oxford until his death. His first wife died in 1851. In 1854 he formed a second marital relation with Debrah Powell, of Peekskill, New York, with whom he lived about twenty-one years, she dying in 1875. Since her death he has lived with his children. He was the father of nine children, all dren. He was the father of nine children, all by his first wife, four surviving; one son, Dr. C. Earl, of Pontiac, and three daughters, the latter all residing in the neighborhood of Oxford. His peaceful, unobtrusive life was the best evidence of his character. In the business transactions of life his aim was to do as the world like to be done by. He prized the he would like to be done by. He prised the friendships and social relations of life and tried so to live as to merit the approval of all with whom he mingled. By prudent and abstemeous habits he enjoyed the best of health, until about a year ago, when palsy, incident to old age, prostrated him, and was the remote cause of his death. Measured by years of life, he is said to be the oldest pio-neer that has died in Osford.
