

PONTIAC BILL POSTER

Little Maude, three-year-old daughter of Nicholas Nott, died last Wednesday evening of diphtheria, and funeral services were held at the house Friday. *Nov 28 1883*

The following notice was received just after the B. P. had gone to press last week. Died, at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. P. T. Lamb, in Holly, Nov. 19, Mrs. A. Tuttle, aged 75 years, 2 months and 26 days. Mrs. T. was a former resident of Pontiac, and also the mother of Mrs. Dr. J. W. Seeley, Detroit, and Sherman Tuttle, Rochester. *Nov 28 1883*

Last Wednesday night, in Summit township, near Jackson, the home of a wealthy farmer was the scene of a wholesale, mysterious, and horrible crime. Jacob Crouch, Henry D. White and wife (the latter a daughter of Mr. C.), and Moses Polley, a visiting drover, were slaughtered in their beds. What money the drover had, a silver watch of White's, and a few other things were taken, but it is thought that revenge prompted the murdered rather than money. A hired girl who slept in the back part of the house, and a negro boy who had a room upstairs are in jail. The woman claims she never heard a shot fired, and the boy only heard a strange noise. Hanging is too good for the wretch who would commit such a dastardly crime, and the sooner capital punishment is restored in Michigan the better. *Nov 28 1883*
