

PONTIAC BILL POSTER

Died, at his home in Waterford, on Tuesday, April 29th, in the 69th year of his age, Mr. Hitchcock. Funeral services were held at the Methodist church at Waterford, conducted by the Rev. Mr. Yokum. *MAY 7, 1884*

Died, on Friday afternoon of last week, Miss Lizzie, daughter of Ed. Healey, of this city, in the 21st year of her age. Funeral services were held Monday forenoon from St. Vincent's church, Rev. Father Baumgartner officiating, and the remains interred in Mt. Hope cemetery. *MAY 7, 1884*

Died, at the home of her parents, in Springfield, April 19, Wm Edgar, Jr, aged 21 years, 8 months, of enteric fever. Services were held at the house on the 20th. *MAY 7, 1884*

Mrs. Elizabeth M., wife of James Andrews, died at her late home in this city last Thursday, aged 81 years and 6 months. Services were held at the house Monday, sermon by Rev. A. E. Berry. Mrs. A. was born at Utica, New York, in 1802, and had been a resident of Pontiac 49 years. Deceased was the mother of Mrs. A. Parker, of this city, and her death is sincerely mourned by a loving husband, relatives and friends. *MAY 14, 1884*

Ex-Police Justice David E. Harbaugh, of Detroit, died at the Pontiac asylum yesterday morning, aged 76 years. *MAY 14, 1884*

Mrs. George Hopkinson, of Pontiac township, died Sunday noon, in the 75th year of her age. Deceased had been successfully treated for a cancer, and was getting along nicely when she caught cold, and died from inflammation of the lungs. Mrs. H. was born at Palmyra, New York, April 8, 1809, and had been married just 53 years the day of her death. With her husband she came to Michigan and Oakland county in 1842, settling on the farm in Pontiac township where she continued to reside up to the time of her death. Mrs. H. was a kind wife and mother, and had been a consistent member of the M. E. church for fifty-five years. She leaves a husband and three children, including S. M. Hopkinson, of this city. Funeral services were held at the house yesterday afternoon, sermon by Rev. J. Joslin, in the presence of many relatives and friends, and the remains were brought to this city for interment. *MAY 14, 1884*

Rev. Chauncey Knickerbocker, who died recently, entered the ministry when twenty-one years of age, and had organized church societies in Wayne, Farmington, New Hudson, Rochester and Pontiac. *MAY 14, 1884*
