Mrs. A. B. Cudworth, of this city, died Sunday morning at her residence on Auburn Avenue, of Bright's disease of the kidneys, aged 70 years. Funeral services were held at the house yesterday forenoon, conducted by Revs. Allen and Jaookes, and the remains taken to Elmwood cemetery, Detroit, for burial. Mrs. C. was born at Cardiff, Onondagus county, New York, Feb. 18, 1818, and came to Michigan with her parents in 1837. She was a devoted wife and mother and leaves a husband and five children. *Feb 8 1888*

Mr. Jewett C. Stockwell, of this city, died last week Tuesday afternoon, of paralysis, aged 59 years, and funeral services were held at the house Thursday afternoon. Deceased was born in Ira township, Cayuga county, New York, and came to Michigan and Pontiac with his parents in 1837. He leaves no family but a large circle of relatives and friends. *Feb 8 1888*

Benjamin Giddings, of Oakwood, was found dead in his bed Thursday. A bullet hole in his head and revolver in his hand showed that he had evidently committed suicide. *Feb 8, 1888*

Mr. H. Short, formerly of the township of Troy, and father of M. H. Short, of this city, died at his home in Hilldale Feb. 1st, aged 63 years. *Feb 8 1888*
