Died, at his residence in Farmington, January 28, 1888, Albert A. Murray, in his forty-first year.

Deceased was born in the township of West Bloomfield, April 2, 1847, and was reared a farmer, and continued in this business until 1882, when he moved to Farmington village and entered the mercantile business, continuing in this to the time of his death. He was a man of good business qualifications and strict integrity and had many warm friends.

He had held many offices of public trust and and at the time of his death was Supervisor of his township. His funeral Sunday, the 29th, was one of the largest ever held in Farmington, Rev. A. F. Niles officiating, after which he was buried by the masonic fraternity, of which deceased was an exemplary member and one of its shining lights, having served many years as Master of his lodge.

He leaves a widow, son and daughter, an aged mother and an only brother to mourn his untimely end. Feb 8 1888
