

PONTIAC BILL POSTER

Mrs. Lena Gehrung, of the third ward, died last Friday morning, aged 26 years, and the funeral was held at the house Sunday. A week previous to her death Mrs. G. was a strong, healthy woman. A few days ago she fell down a step leading from one room to another, with a tub of water, but wasn't aware she had sustained any injury. Shortly after she complained of a pain in her left side, and had symptoms of typhoid fever. A physician was called, and she grew better, but became suddenly worse Thursday and died the next morning at five o'clock. Deceased was a hard working woman and a true wife and mother. She leaves a husband, mother, brother and many friends to mourn her untimely death. *Aug 4 1886*

While Mrs. John J. Hall, of Bloomfield, was coming down stairs at the Cong'l church Sunday at the close of morning service she had a stroke of paralysis and became insensible. She was removed to the residence of Harry Tyler and medical aid summoned, but died at twelve o'clock Sunday night, aged 78 years. Deceased was born in Orange county New York, and came to this county in 1837. Funeral this (Wednesday) afternoon at 2 o'clock from the residence of Harry Tyler on Clark street. *Aug 11 1886*
