

Death of Chas. M. Richmond.

On Sunday, December 4, Charles M. Richmond, one of the pioneers of old Oakland, died at his home in White Lake, aged 64 years, of chronic inflammation of the stomach.

Mr. Richmond was born in Galen, Wayne county, N. Y., Aug. 9, 1823. He was a son of John Richmond, who with a family of eight children emigrated to Michigan in the fall of 1836, locating in White Lake, which was at that time almost a dense forest. In 1852 Charles M. Richmond married Miss Marion Webster, of Pontiac township, and settled on the farm where he resided at the time of his death.

He leaves a wife and seven children: Mrs. Thos. McNulty, Mrs. Jay Stockwell, Mrs. Theodore Allen, C. E. Willard, Fred and John Richmond, all of White Lake. Deceased was a brother of Horace Richmond and Mrs. John Webster, of Bath; Mrs. David Tuttle, of Clyde, New York; Mrs. L. Spencer, of Newaygo, and Mrs. A. J. Webster, of this city.

Funeral services were held at the late residence of the deceased Tuesday, December 6, at 1 o'clock p. m., and were conducted by Rev. Chandler, in the midst of a large concourse of relatives and friends, who followed the remains to their last resting place in Ox Bow cemetery. Dec 14 1887
