

Apr 18. **Obituary.** 1888

Mrs. Hannah Kemp Carey, who died March 29, 1888, was born in Bredon, Sussex county, England, 1812, lived there until seven years of age, then went to Battle, same county, with her parents, lived there until her marriage in 1833. Two children were born to her in England. In 1839 she came with her husband, Henry Carey, to America and settled in the township of Pontiac, on what is now known as the John Carey farm, lived there eight years and then purchased the farm, now the John Maitrott farm, where she died, remaining on it 32 years. In 1883 she and her husband celebrated there 50th wedding anniversary with her children. In 1884, they removed to Flint to live with their son, John H. Carey. In 1858 she was baptized. The Saviour was very dear to her. Her life was a peaceful and contented one, ever looking after the care of her nine children, eight now living, Willie dying in 1879, and caring for others; surely "Her children can rise up and call her blessed." In her early pioneer life, through all her trials and disappointments she never lost sight of the Savior. Only the Maker of all good could provide such a thing as we shall mention; four week ago she left Flint to make her children and many friends a short visit, and as it was to be, she died in her old home, where many years of care was hers.

She leaves a husband who is aged and infirm, to finish his earthly travels alone, in the care of his children. "She hath done what she could." We mourn our loss but not without hope. Com.
