Yesterday morning our citizens were pained and surprised to learn of the sudden death of Jackson Voorheis, who passed away at eight o'clock. For sometime the deceased had been in poor health, but was able to be around till Friday when he was stricken down with congestion of the lungs. Mr. Voorheis was born in Seneca county, New York, Sept. 14, 1822, and came to Michigan and Oakland county in 1844. Three years later he married Betsey Hathaway, who survives him.
