Mrs. Catherine Hurlbut died last week Tuesday evening at her home in the second ward of pneumonia, aged 68 years, and funeral services were held at the Baptist church Thursday. Deceased had lived in Pontiac over 50 years, and her death is mourned by a large circle of relatives and friends.

Albert F. Draper, brother of Hon. Chas. Draper, of this city, for two years the popular landlord of the Hodges House, died Saturday morning last, at 8 o'clock, of malarial fever, after an illness of about four weeks, aged 68 years. Mr. Draper was an old real-estate dealer, but for some years past been engaged in the hotel business in different parts of the State. About two years ago he leased the Hodges House, which under his capable management, has grown in public estimation and in patronage. APR 14 Death of David Leland. 1886
David Leland, of Waterford, died at his late home, on Monday evening, April 5th, of inflammation of the lungs, aged 71 years. Mr. Leland was born in Lincolnshire, England, August 14, 1814. He came to America and to Michigan in 1840, where he remained until 1843, when he went to Chili, Monroe county, New York, where he was married, Aug. 20, 1845, when he came to Milford, this county, where he lived until the following winter, when he moved to Waterford, where he resided until his death. As a parent and a citizen he was one of earth's choicest gifts, true and faithful in every relation of life. This is the character of the man as we knew him through a period of 30 years, an opinion which the community with whom he had lived for many years will endorse. The funeral was held from the Leland home Tuesday, April 1st, Rev. J. M. Gelston officiating, and the remains were placed in the Petrie vault in Oak Hill cemetery.

Mrs. Lee Rush, nee Kate Miller, of Mt. Vernon, died last Saturday and funeral services were held Monday.

Deceased formerly resided in Oakland township, this county, and had only been married about a year. She was widely known and highly respected.

Mrs. A. K. Warner, mother of Mrs. H. Beardsley, of this city, died at the home of her daughter, on Mt. Clemens street, Sunday night at 7 o'clock of apoplexy, having had three shocks that day. She was born in Dutchess county, New York, and was 76 years of age. She had been failing for several months, but was under the doctor's care but 3 days.
