Death of Harrison Lewis.

The gentleman above named died at Bay City last Thursday, of apoplexy, and the Tribune says of him: "Harrison Lewis was a native of Vermont, but when very young he removed with his parents to New York state, where his boybood days were passed. In 1837, when twenty-one years of age, he came to Michigan, settling in Oakland Co., where in 1845 he was united in marriage to Nancy L. Van Tuyl, who, with her only child, H. S. Lewis, survives the deceased. From Oakland county he removed to Genesee county where he resided several years, coming to West Bay City in 1872 and engaging in the grocery business, which wis continued till 1880, when with his son, H. S. Lewis he opened a hardware store on the corner of Mildand and Henry streets, which was successfully conducted until last year, when the business was sold to Bissell & Mather. since which time the deceased has been out of business.

Harrison Lewis was remarkable for the uprightness of his life and business integrity, and retiring, unassuming disposition, and was held in the highest esteem by all with whom he was brought in social or business contact, for his pure and noble manhood.
