Orion Review. "Died, at his late residence in Orion, on Monday evening, Feb. 14, 1886, John Berridge, aged 67 years. Deceased was born at Polington, Smith Parish, Yorkshire, England, August 17, 1810, and came to this country in 1834; worked in Detroit, at whip-sawing, for about a year, when, in the spring of 1836 he located on the farm now owned by his son Henry in Orion township. After selling the farm to his son, he moved into this village, where he had ever since resided. He had held the office of township treasurer for three terms. The deceased leaves a wife and six children. Mr. B. was a man highly esteemed by all with whom he came in contact. A large circle of friends and relatives were present to witness the last rites, which were solemnized at the Methodist church on Thursday last, Rev. Whitcomb officiating. The remains were taken to Pontiac and deposited in the Petrie vault."
