South Lyon Excelsior: "James B. Toneray, widely known through Oakland and Livingston counties died suddenly Tuesday morning at his home in this village. He slept unusually well during the night, and at about 5 o'clock rolled suddenly over, drew a long breath and without speaking, passed quietly away. Mr. Toneray followed milling as a profession for many years, having charge of the Green Oak and Woodruff mills for a long time." *Aug 24 1887*

Orion Review: "The venerable Mrs. Wallace died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Allen Brewster, last week Tuesday and was buried at Oakwood Saturday. Mrs. Wallace was born at Mt. Holly, Vt.
