APR 27,1887 Last Thursday afternoon Clarence, a six year old son of E. D. Widrig was taken sick at Miss Walter's room in the old union and was sent home. The little fellow grew worse rapidly, and in spite of medical attendance died the next forenoon. Owing to the fact that a couple of little fellows the same age examination was made by Drs. How ever the fact that for several hours

previous to his death little Carence frequently implored to be pretected from the school mates who had made an attack upon him, gave color to the suspicion that Clarence had been foully dealt with. Coroner Culver therefore empanneled a jury and a careful post On account of the illness of one of the juror's their finding was not announced till yesterday afternoon, when a verdict of death from natural causes was rendered. Funeral services were afternoon at two o'clock,
