

## Death of Mrs. Chester W. Tuthill.

The lady whose sudden death it is our sad duty to chronicle, died at her home on Tuesday evening last, of apoplexy, the stroke which caused her death being the third visitation.

In the afternoon, while preparing for a supper which was to commemorate, with a general family reunion, the fifth wedding anniversary of her daughter, Nellie, she was suddenly prostrated, and though immediate assistance was rendered, became unconscious, and remained in that condition until her death, which occurred about 9 o'clock in the evening.

The deceased was born in Ireland, Nov. 20, 1829, making her a few months over 56 years old at her death.

She was the daughter of the late Richard Scarrett, who, before his death, lived many years at White Lake. She came to Michigan and Oakland county with her parents in 1836.

She was married to Mr. Tuthill in 1857. She leaves a husband and three children, Mrs. Julia Howland, Mrs. Mel Soper, and a young son, Chester, two Howland grandchildren, and several brothers and sisters, among the latter is Mrs. H. M. Jackson and Mrs. Hickey of this city.

The funeral was held from the M. E. church on Friday afternoon, and the remains deposited in the Petrie vault.

Mrs. Tuthill was a devoted member and constant attendant of the M. E. church, and a kind hearted, charitable, christian woman. In relieving the needy and administering comfort and consolation to the sick and afflicted, she was constant and unostentatious, doing good and bringing happiness to all who were brought in contact with her.
