Saturday morning a telegram was received by H. M. Linabury, of Pontiac, announcing the death of his brother, Joseph Linabury, by drowning. The sad news soon spread about town and universal regret was manifested by our citizens. It seems the railroad company Joe was with recently built a hunters' hotel at Hope, Idaho, and made Mr. L. landlord. Friday afternoon, Joe and a trapper went fishing on the lake in front of the hotel in separate boats, and in a few minutes drifted several rods apart within calling distance from shore. In a short time the trapper looked around to see how Mr. L. was progressing and was astonished to see Joe's boat overturned. He hastily rowed to the spot but the unfortunate man was out of sight, and at this writing his body has not been recovered. Joe. was a good swimmer, and must have been suddenly stricken down with apoplexy or something of the kind. For years deceased was with the McConnells, of this city, and he had a host of friends who mourn his untimely death and heartily sympathize with his family in their sad affliction.
