### A Pioneer Gone. *Oct 6 1886*

Mrs. Mary Ann Hunt died at the residence of her son-in-law, H. A. Randall, Birmingham, on Monday, Sept. 27, 1886, aged 76 years, 10 months and 28 days. Deceased came to Michigan with her parents in June 1830; was twice married, first to Marcus Culver, who died in Aug. 1837, leaving her with one child, a daughter. March 3, 1844, she was married to James M. Hunt, with whom she lived on the farm 2 1/2 miles west of Birmingham until his death, which occurred June 23, 1885, and by whom she had four children, one daughter and three sons, who are all living except one. She was a devoted wife, an indulgent mother, a constant friend, a true woman; known only to be loved and respected.
