Speaking of Calvin S. Hamlin, whose death we noticed last week, the Gazette says: "The deceased was the son of Elijah Hamlin, born in the township of Avon, May, 28, 1836. He came to Pontiac to live some 20 years ago, where he has resided continuously since. He was afflicted with a shock of paralysis three years ago, since that time he has been an invalid, and the subject of constant care, imposing on his wife and daughters a severe and wearisome burden, which was cheerfully and devotedly borne. He leaves a wife two daughters and one son, the latter living in Chicago."
