

PONTIAC BILL POSTER

June 20 1886

Henry C. Linabury, of this city, died at his home on Perry street Saturday afternoon at four o'clock, after a long illness, in the 75th year of his age. Funeral from the house Monday afternoon, sermon by Rev. C. T. Allen. Mr. L. was born in New Jersey, came to Pontiac about fifty years ago, and continued to make this city his residence up to the time of his death. The deceased was a life-long democrat, and always took considerable interest in political matters. His wife and six children, H. M. Linabury, of this city, Albert Linabury, of Detroit, Aug. Linabury, of New Zealand, Mrs. J. J. Strong and Mrs. J. F. Lobdell, of St. Paul, and Mrs. Frank Horton, of Daveuport, survive him. As a business man and good citizen, Mr. L. will be long and favorably remembered.
