Death of Mary Hull King.

Dec 25 1889

Died in Essexville, Mich., Wednesday morning, Dec. 18th inst, at the home of her son, Rev. Walter D. King, Mrs. Mary Hull King. aged 85 years, 9 months and 28 days. The remains were brought to Commerce and buried on Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock, in the village burying grounds, beside the remains of her husband.

Deceased was born in Canandaigua, Ontario, county, New York, Feb. 20, 1804. was married and continued to live there until the year 1838, when she removed to Monroe county, from whence she moved to Michigan in 1857, settling in Commerce, where her two sons, A. S. and W. D., had preceded her. She lived in Commerce until the death of her husband in 1870, since which time she lived with one or the other of her two sons. She joined the Presbyterian church in about the year 1830, since which time she had been connected with either the Presbyterian or Congregational churches. She was a member of the latter denomination when in Pontiac. She had been an invalid from rheumatic complaints some 10 years.

The deceased during her long life with its cares and changes had been a faithful wife, kind mother and a christian exemplar. At a ripe old age she has entered into rest.
