Tunis A. Rollson, of this city, died Sunday morning of heart disease, aged 58 years. Funeral from the house this (Wednesday) afternoon at one o'clock. The deceased was born at Hamburg, Warren county, New Jersey, July 11, 1830 and four years later came to Michigan with his parents who settled at Stony Creek. Ten years later the family removed to Brandon where the deceased assisted in clearing up a homestead. At the death of his father Mr. R. purchased the farm and May 3, 1868, was married to Sarah P. eldest daughter of Peter Brewster, of Pontiac who survives him. The deceased also leaves four children and two stepsons. Circuit Court Commissioner Bromley, of this city, and Byron C. Bromley, of Houghton, Dakota. Five sisters of the deceased are still living, viz; Mrs. Julius Carpenter, of Eames, Mrs. Abram Truax, of Owosso; Mrs. Cal. Reynolds, of Lakeview; Mrs. Margaret Perry, and Mrs. John L. Rollson, of Brandon. Mr. Rollson was a man of strong likes and dislikes, honorable and square in his dealings and a good citizen. *July 25 1888*
