STATE OF MICHIGAN, County of Oakland, ss. At a session of the Probate Court for the County of Oakland, holden at the Probate office, in the city of Pontiac, on Monday, the 22d. day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

In the matter of the estate of Israel Smith deceased.
