Stanton died seized, in and to the following real estate, situate and being in the village of Oxford, Oakland county, Michigan, and more particularly specified and described as follows: Commencing at a point on the south line of section 22, town 5, north range 10 east distance eight chains and fifty-two links (8.52), east of the quarter post on the south side of said section, thence running north three chains and forty-five links (3.45); thence north  $58^{\circ} 55'$ , east perpendicular to Lapeer St. two chains to the center of said street; thence south  $31^{\circ} 55'$ , east six chains and thirty-one links to the intersection of Lapeer and Burdick streets, thence west along the above mentioned section line four chains and fifty-one links to the place of beginning, excepting a piece of land commencing at a point in the center of Lapeer road on the line between section 22 and 27 in the village of Oxford, running thence northerly in the center of said road one hundred and ten feet; thence westerly in a direction that it will strike the section line between sections 22 and 27 by running one hundred and ninety feet, (198), thence east on said section line to the place of beginning, be the same more or less belonging to Alfred Hagerman.
