

### PONTIAC BILL POSTER

**STATE OF MICHIGAN**, county of Oakland, ss.—At a session of the Probate Court for the county of Oakland, holden at the Probate Office, in the city of Pontiac, on the 11th day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

Present, Thomas L. Patterson, Judge of Probate.

In the matter of the estate of Almira Brainard, deceased.

On reading and filing the petition, duly verified, of Charles H. Oltz, a son of the deceased, praying among other things for the Probate of an instrument in writing, heretofore filed in this court, purporting to be the last will and testament of said Almira Brainard, deceased, and that administration may be granted to Charles H. Oltz, the Executor named in the will, or some other suitable person.

Thereupon it is ordered, that the 4th day of June, 1885, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, be assigned for the hearing of said petition, and that the heirs at law of said deceased, and all other persons interested in said estate, are required to appear at a session of said court, then to be holden at the Probate Office in the city of Pontiac, and show cause, if any there be, why the prayer of the petitioner should not be granted; and it is further ordered, that said petitioner give notice to the persons interested in said estate of the pendency of said petition, and the hearing thereof, by causing a copy of this order to be published in the Pontiac Bill Poster, a newspaper printed and circulating in said county of Oakland, three successive weeks previous to said day of hearing.
