## PONTIAC BILL POSTER

STATE OF MICHIGAN, County of Oakland, ss.—At a session of the Probate Court for the County of Oakland, holden at the Probate Office, in the City of Pontiac, on the 1st day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.
