

PONTIAC BILL POSTER.

STATE OF MICHIGAN, County of Oakland ss.—At a session of the Probate Court for the County of Oakland, holden at the Probate Office in the City of Pontiac, on the 17th day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

Present—Thomas L. Patterson, Judge of Probate.

In the matter of the estate of John Wilkins, deceased. On reading and filing the petition of Thaddeus A. Smith and Seth A. Paddock, executors of the last will of Charles Mascord, praying that they as such executors may be allowed to present and have allowed the final account of Charles Mascord, in his lifetime the executor of the last will of the said John Wilkins, and further praying for the allowance of said final account, that the estate of said John Wilkins be decreed settled and the bond of the executor canceled and an order made that said estate be settled and the estate of Charles Mascord discharged.
