

PONTIAC BILL POSTER

PROBATE ORDER—State of Michigan, County of Oakland, ss.—At a session of the Probate Court for the County of Oakland, holden at the Probate Office, in the city of Pontiac, on the 7th day of April, in the year, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five. Present, Thomas L. Patterson, Judge of Probate.

In the matter of the estate of Thomas Russell, deceased.

On application of Humphrey Russell and Wm. W. Russell, the executors of the will of Nancy M. Russell, praying among other things that they may present and have allowed the final account of Nancy M. Russell in her lifetime the executrix of the will of Thomas Russell, and that the estate of Nancy M. Russell be released from further responsibility to the estate of Thomas Russell, and that the estate of Thomas Russell be decreed settled. *APR 22 1885*

In the matter of the estate of Matilda Clapp, deceased.

On application of Joseph Clapp, administrator of said estate, praying for an examination and allowance of his final account, himself discharged, his bond canceled and the estate decreed settled.

Thereupon it is ordered, that the 14th day of May, 1885, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, be assigned for the hearing of said application, and that the heirs at law of said deceased, and all other persons interested in said estate, are required to appear at a session of said court, then to be holden at the Probate Office, in the city of Pontiac, and show cause, if any there be, why the prayer of the applicant should not be granted; and it is further ordered, that said applicant give notice to the persons interested in said estate, of the pendency of said application and the hearing thereof, by causing a copy of this order to be published in the Pontiac Bill Poster, a newspaper printed and circulating in said county of Oakland, three successive weeks.
