STATE OF MICHIGAN, County of Oakland, ss.—At a Session of the Probate Court for the County of Oakland, holden at the Probate Office, in the City of Pontiac, on the 15th day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

Present—Thomas L. Patterson, Judge of Probate.

In the matter of the estate of Eliza White, deceased.

On reading and filing the petition, duly verified, of William Malkim, a son-in-law of said deceased, praying among other things that administration may be had on said estate, and that David Dickie or some other suitable person may be appointed administrator:

In the matter of the estate of Robert McBratney, deceased.

On reading and filing the petition, duly verified, of George D. McBratney, son of said deceased, praying that the dower of the widow may be assigned to her and that commissioners may be appointed and required to set off said dower by metes and bounds of the real estate of said deceased in said petition described.
