PROBATE ORDER.—State of Michigan, county of Oakland, ss.—At a session of the Probate Court for the county of Oakland, holden at the Probate Office, in the city of Pontiac, on the 26th day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five. Present, Thomas L. Patterson, Judge of Probate.

In the matter of the estate of John Swan, deceased.
