

PONTIAC BILL POSTER

PROBATE ORDER.—State of Michigan, County of Oakland, ss.—At a session of the Probate Court for the County of Oakland, holden at the Probate Office, in the city of Pontiac, on Tuesday, the 15th day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven. Present, Thomas L. Patterson, Judge of Probate. In the matter of the Estate of Adolphus Granger, deceased.

On reading and filing the petition, duly verified, of Mary Granger, praying among other things for license to sell the real estate of said deceased as in said petition described.

Thereupon it is ordered, that Monday, the 19th day of December, 1887, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, be assigned for the hearing of said petition, and that the heirs at law of said deceased and all other persons interested in said estate, are required to appear at a session of said Court, to be holden at the Probate Office, in the city of Pontiac, and show cause, if any there be, why the prayer of the petitioner should not be granted; and it is further ordered, that said petitioner give notice to the persons interested in said estate, of the pendency of said petition and the hearing thereof, by causing a copy of this order to be published in the Pontiac Bill Poster, a newspaper printed and circulated in said county of Oakland, three successive weeks previous to said day of hearing.
