Raises for city workers

A budget amendment placing Clarkston's budget in deficit includes raises for several city employees.

They deserve them, said new City Manager Carol Eberhardt.

"No one had had a raise in eight years," Eberhardt said. "People work hard and no one should go without a raise for eight years."

City of the Village of Clarkston's 2012/2013 budget amendment, approved April 22, changes it from a \$9,389 surplus to \$40,926 deficit, a difference of \$50,315,

Salary raises include: clerk, \$9,800 to \$10,664, 8.8 percent; treasurer, \$11,455 to \$15,563, 35.9 percent; clerical staff, \$7,288 to \$8,463, 16.1 percent; grounds

staff, \$15,000 to \$22,093, 47.3 percent, and Building Department clerical staff, \$9,000 to \$11,688. 29.9 percent.

Also, engineering services fees increase from \$3,000 to \$9,200, and audit fees are up \$3,172. Building and Grounds is up by \$6,815 due to phragmites burning, vandalism repair in Depot Park, and unexpected work in the village hall garage. A Capital Outlay increase of \$7,292 includes a paving project on Holcomb and Valley View Drive.

The council approved the raises based on the recommendation of a special committee formed by previous City Manager Dennis Ritter to explore the issue.

Funds to cover the increase in salaries were pulled from the

Public speaks on school budget

As Clarkston schools consider how to close a \$3.8 million budget deficit, residents were split at a public hearing, April 22.

The school district faces a \$3.8 million deficit due to decreasing state and federal revenues, decreased enrollment, and increased costs. About 15 residents spoke at the hearing at Clarkston Junior High School.

Township said open enrollment is a short-sighted solution.

"I do not believe that is the best option available - the long term needs to be considered. Boor said.

Alternatives to consider include allowing current students at the district's Funshine preschool, already an openenrollment program, and the children of part-time Clarkston employees to enroll with the district, she said.

city's fund balance of \$321,718, which Eberhardt said is very healthy.

"The state of Michigan recommends communities have a reserve fund of 18-23 percent, and Clarkston has about 45 percent of a reserve," she said.

Eberhardt said the reserve fund is healthy because of conservative budgeting.

"Some things come up that we just cannot foresee like the Depot Park being vandalized," said Treasurer Sandra Barlass. "We had to repair the damage done, and that was not an expense we expected."

Many services and expenses must be estimated, such as the amount of salt needed each winter, or the amount of time engineers spend on planned or unforeseen projects, Eberhardt said.

In the amendment, total revenue was changed from \$644,678 to \$663,902, and spending, \$635,289 to \$704,828.

A third sign would be placed on White Lake Road just before Depot Road, and the last wayfinding sign would go at the southwest corner of Depot Road and Main Street.

In shades of orange, gold, and brown, the custom 24 inch by 36 inch signs say "Clarkston Historic District, established in 1832. National register of historic places, designated by the U.S. Dept. of the Interior in 1980."

Estimated cost for the four signs and their metal posts is \$5,000. Each Historic District sign would cost approximately \$1,175. If the City Council could not afford the signs, the subcommittee would consider fund raising and grant writing to pay for the markers, Catallo

The subcommittee also proposed street signs with white lettering that would have a round marker designating the historic district; however, they were not figured into the estimated \$5,000 cost.

City Council agreed to look into financing the signage and gave unanimous approval for the subcommittee to seek bids. In addition, they were asked to research the permitting process required by the Michigan Department of Transportation for the new markers.

The next Planning Commission meeting is scheduled for May 6 and City Council will meet again on May 13. Both meetings will take place at 7 p.m. at the Village Hall.

For Clarkston Board of Education and administration, May means crunching numbers for the next school year's budget.

Things are different this time, compared to what I've seen the last few

Previously, they'd work out the plan, and if money coming from the state or feds wouldn't cover it, they'd pull the difference out of the district's fund balance, its savings account.

That's not happening this time.

Those savings are about tapped out. So now they must ensure spending doesn't exceed income, or else the state sends someone to do it for them

Now that it has come down to this, decisions should be easier, or at least

No more consideration of whether the district can weather a few more years, depending on the fund-balance cushion while hoping for economic improvements.

That ship has sailed.

Funding is at 2005 levels, as explained by Deputy Superintendent Shawn Ryan at the public hearing last week. So it would make sense to reset as many expenditures at 2005 levels as well.

Many saw this coming for years, probably for decades. When pensions and retirement plans were negotiated, I'm sure someone looked at employment and retirement rates, factoring in mortality rates, and calculated about when legacy costs would overwhelm the ability of taxpayers to support them.

Right about now, it would probably have been.

Charges against city underserved, reader says

Dear Editor.

The letter "City manager search," April 24, is an example of uninformed criticism of Clarkston's city government, apparently motivated by hostility and dislike of anyone who holds political office and a cynical assumption these folks do whatever they want regardless of the law.

Close review of the language of the city charter, quoted in the letter, shows the city council did nothing wrong, let alone "illegal."

First, the charter prohibits elected officers from holding an appointed city office. That didn't happen here. Carol Eberhardt resigned her council seat before becoming city

Second, it prohibits a former elected officer from holding a compensated city office for one year after that officer's term. That did happen here. But there is an exception to this

The exception can be "authorized by ... five members of the council." Before deciding on appointing a city manager, the council voted to authorize this exception. Thus Ms. Eberhardt's appointment was authorized by

The premise of the criticism is that you can't change a law after the fact and authorize something that was a violation when it happened. But that's not what happened

The charter allows the council to invoke an exception to the general rule. The council invoked the exception before it decided who would be appointed city manager.

The claim "the council broke the law the moment they publicly announced they were considering [Eberhardt] for the job" is wrong. The charter doesn't prohibit considering a council member for appointment. So considering someone for whom a future waiver might be needed is not "illegal." And ultimately the council can waive the prohibitions by a supermajority vote, which it did.

To characterize the city manager selection process as "shenanigans" belittles those who worked in good faith on this important appointment. The council considered 12 applicants, interviewed five, and heard presentations from the final two.

Most of the process, unfortunately not all of it, was done publicly. Anyone could have looked at the applications and had their voice heard at various public meetings. I did

For example, I suggested, and the council agreed, adding a candidate to the interview schedule. I'm no apologist for all that our council does and I've been critical of many things, both while on the council and off. But criticisms should be based in fact. The facts don't support the criticism here.

decided staying in-state was the best choice for her. She will be attending Michigan Technological University in the fall, where her parents are both alumni, to study Pre-Veterinary Science.


"The campus is beautiful, and they had the program I wanted to pursue







The Lady Wolves placed in seven events with the 3,200-meter relay team finishing in sixth at 10:26.35.





Bikers have a new trail to try, thanks to Eagle Scout Connor Eckhout of Springfield Township.

> with a 3-mile dirt trail at the corner of Rattalee Lake and Reese roads.

"We considered the area behind the high school, but it's not what we were looking for. It's not big enough," he said. This is a better choice. It's not very hilly, but it definitely works out well. It has a lot of cool areas.



"It was quite a task," the Eagle Scout said. "The hard part was the planning and getting everyone together."

One stumbling block was blazing the trail through the sod.

The scout has had the goal of achieving Eagle for a long time, said his parents, Michael and Katherine Eckhout.

"As a Cub Scout, Connor first saw and talked to an Eagle Scout on Mackinac Island who was working near the fort in full uniform," Michael said. "He told us he wanted to be an Eagle too."

The bike trail project, which is open to the public, took more a year to finish.

"We were at a race in Lake Orion last year, and I asked my coach (Lori Payne) if she had any ideas for an Eagle project," Connor said. "She had this idea floating around for a while.'



Kids learn about life of salmon

Andersonville Elementary fourth grader Olivia Neubeck may enjoy eating different foods at lunch, but she has learned salmon do not share the same taste in food as she and her classmates.

"They eat insects," she explained about the salmon the fourth graders have been raising and taking care of in their classrooms. "They can eat dragonflies even though they don't live in the water. When a dragonfly goes up to the water, the salmon can get them.'

They have also learned about the different predators preying on the salmon - like the sea lamprey.

'The sea lamprey attaches to them," she said. "It sucks out their blood so they die."

"They have to camouflage," added Gavin Conrad. "It helps them adapt to not getting


The students participated in hands-on activities last Friday. They looked at insects the salmon eat as well as the environment they live

Other activities include a salmon survival activity and a scents activity where the salmon maneuver down branches of a river to get back to their habitat.

"They have learned about the behaviors and the habitats of the salmon," said Andrea Lockwood, fourth grade teacher.

The project was part of the students' animal unit and was funded by the National Steelheaders Association. Andersonville Elementary is the only school in Clarkston participating in the project.



The district's fund equity was more than \$16 million in 2005, about \$10 million in 2010. and about \$3.8 million by this June.

"We're getting to that position where we're really kind of at the end of road," Ryan said "I'm hopeful, looking at rising home values and economic data, Michigan is coming back."

Administration's budget plan to make up the deficit includes equal parts spending reductions; new revenue from outside the district; and savings in employee benefits, insurance, and other human-resource costs.

The school board asked administration to also look at privatizing some services, cutting or reducing transportation, and other measures. Closing an elementary school could save about \$460,000; combining, schools or programs, \$140,000; privatize custodial services, \$600,000-\$1.2 million; privatizing busing, \$270,000-300,000; eliminate transportation, up to \$1.86 million.

These are not recommended by administration, Rock said.
