A walk-through scheduled with MDOT and Eberhardt was cancelled after MDOT officials told her representatives had already conducted a walk-through of Main Street.

Issues with a cross walk on Sashabaw as well as traffic light timing have also been noticed by residents and local officials.

One of those ongoing issues is the crosswalk light on Sashabaw Road near Bow Point Drive.

Independence Township resident Michael Powell has complained about the Sashabaw crosswalk for years, saying timing is amiss and dangerous.

Public information officer for the Road Commission of Oakland County (RCOC) Craig Bryson said no changes are planned for that cross-

Eberhardt said traffic on Main Street often runs too fast, and there are also timing issues with a light at Main Street and Clarkston Road.

"The lights stays red for so long," she said. "So Main Street gets backed up and it's just gridlocked."

Eberhardt said part of the problem is the light at Clarkston Road's timing is not changed when school is let

Local business owner Bruce Mercado said he has noticed when people want to turn left off Clarkston Road, the green arrow takes too long to change, causing a huge traffic congestion issue.

"I looked up and saw the cameras, walked out and looked at them and then I pulled my truck up and I got out and waved to the cameras," he said. "Then I got to thinking about it and I'm wondering what they're for."

Where does our privacy start, he wondered.

"Is this another way for the government to spy on the American people," he asked, noting planes and drones can look right into your house. "Where does spying on our country stop? When do they stop interfering with our privacy?"

Craig Bryson, public information officer for the Road Commission for Oakland County, said the cameras are for traffic control and will not

be used for spying on people or issuing tickets.

"We are in traffic not law enforcement," said Bryson.

The cameras are part of the Faster and Safer Travel through Routing and Advanced Controls system, FAST-TRAC.

"It is a traffic operation center," Bryson said. "It does not store any information or images."

Bryson said Michigan is home to the second largest system of its type in the country behind Los Angeles.

FAST-TRACK also has the capabilities to report any malfunctions of traffic lights.

Bryson said the system detects how much traffic is at an intersection and then sends that information to a computer located at the intersection.


He assures the lights are not used to catch people running red lights or violating traffic laws, but only detect cars, help control traffic, and analyze traffic flow.

"The cameras detect algorithms and analyze the information to keep the traffic flowing," said Bryson. "These signals change to respond to traffic."

Bryson said the RCOC maintains over 90 percent of the 1,500 hundred traffic signals in the county, but MDOT managers the FAST-TRAC system.

On their website, the RCOC said because Michigan is the fastest growing state in the

## Trimesters up for recall

Trimesters may be history in Clarkston as the Board of Education considers switching back to semesters.

The change, which would take effect next September if approved, would increase focus on core curriculum, class continuity, connections between students and teachers, and opportunities for cross curricular collaboration, said Assistant Superintendent Shawn Ryan at the Oct. 28 school board meeting.

School board members said they were concerned about the timing.

"When we were making the decision to go to trimesters, it seemed to be studied for a long time," said Board Vice President Susan Boatman. "We seem we doing this really fast."

Scott Bendle, parent of a high school junior, agreed.

"This does feel a little fast," said Bendle,

during public comment. "I'm a little disappointed that this would happen in his senior year – this feels wrong right now. More is needed."

"It's important to keep parents in the loop," said Trustee Cheryl McGinnis. "It's important to make sure they have this information."

Trustee Stephen Hyer said they considered 6-7 scheduling options when deciding to go to trimesters. They also had to make curriculum changes to meet new state requirements and the trimester system.

"That took a significant amount of time," Hyer said.

It would be easier to move back, he said. Ryan said a committee of administrators and teachers has been working on it for the past 18 months.

## Township seeks public comments

Independence Township officials are asking for citizen comments about the Sashabaw and Dixie Highway corridors. Comments will be used to make decisions about the communities Master Plan.

During a joint meeting with the Independence Township Board of Directors and the Planning Commission to review the Township's master plan, comments made by local leaders were added to get the site started

Comments left by residents and officials so far include.

"Finish safety/walking path on south side of Clarkston Road between Sashabaw and Pine Knob Road," said J. Schultz.

Another note left by Shultz suggested an area south of DTE Energy going south-bound on Sashabaw needs a right turn lane to go onto 1-75 North. "Too many near misses as people slow down to try to make this hard turn."

Other comments and suggestions for Sashabaw Road include building a community center, working on safety concerns for bicyclists and pedestrians, adding green spaces and trees, adding pocket parks to-promote pedestrian traffic,

Independence Township Parks, Recreation and Seniors Director Ken Elwert asked "Could we use the electric right of way to connect school, park, neighborhoods and business on Sashabaw? If a way could be found around the edges of the golf course to the west maybe this right of way could help connect our Dixie and Sashabaw Corridors in a pedestrian friendly way."

One note said opportunities need to be

sought to create community gardens and green spaces on Sashabaw Road.

Dixie Highway needs more green too, one commenter expressed.

Independence Township Trustee Andrea Schroeder commented there needs to be improved cross-traffic and left turn access on Sashabaw Road between Hidden Lakes and Maybee Road.

Schroeder also said the Michigan left turns need to be reviewed.

Dixie Highway notes include installing entrance signs on both the north and south end of the township. "Lets own it," said one comment.

Cory Johnston said a "Safety Path does not continue along a dealership property even though it exists on Dixie and north of property on M-15. Lack of connectivity and continuity is a problem for making these pedestrian amenities usable and worthwhile. This is also a very dangerous place to cross the road due to right and left turns off Dixie, so crossing M-15 to get to the sidewalk on the other side is not an easy thing to do."

Other comments for Dixie included focusing on pedestrian safety and working to develop vacant properties.

Visitors to the site can add comments anonymously about several issues with the two corridors including improving traffic and pedestrian safety, improving identity and visual image of both corridors, and improving commercial and residential development.



## Half marathon ready to go

In four days, Clarkston's back roads will be filled with about 1,100 runners and walkers. The inaugeral Clarkston State Bank Back Roads Half Marathon is sold out.

"We're ecstatic, thrilled," said Deanna Hart of High Five Races, who is organizing the race along with Megan Holt. "Our goal initially was about 850. Once we got beyond that, it just exploded."

This is the perfect time of year for the race, following the Brooksie Way half marathon and Detroit Free Press Marathon.

"People are still interested in running,"
Hart said.

They decided to close registration for the race due to the back roads route, though a waiting list was established.

"We decided to close it for security and safety," she said. "In its first year, we want it to be executed really well."

The half marathon, 10K run and walk all start from Depot Park in downtown Clarkston, with free parking and shuttle service from Clarkston Elementary on Waldon Road.

Army reservists, sheriffs deputies, and volunteers on horses will provide race marshall services along the route, which starts on Holcomb Road north to Bridge Lake, Rattalee Lake, Reese, to Oak Hill, then south on Allen back to Holcomb, ending with a couple kilometers through the Deerhill subdivision. The finish line is on Washington at Main Street.


Holcomb Road will be closed while runners and walkers are on the route.

"We're all excited – we hope it's a beautiful day with sunshine," Hart said.

Community response has been good, with neighbors along the route posting signs in their yards and the Wolf Pack Running Club of Clarkston hosting training runs in the weeks leading up to the race.

"The response has been pretty great," she said. "Special thanks to the Wolf Pack for leading the runs."

Packet pick up is on Saturday, Nov. 9; from 10 a.m. -2 p.m. at Clarkston State Bank, 15 S. Main Street. On race day, packet pick-up is 7-9 a.m. near the start line in Depot Park, 375 Depot Drive.

## Run for the hills

With four days until Clarkston State Bank Back Roads Half Marathon, my training is over.

I probably should have got in some more. My goal is to finish safely, with a secondary goal of maintaining a technically running pace the entire time.

This won't be easy, especially up and down the hills of the Deer Lake neighborhood. I've been up there twice on training runs but neither were the

correct route. It winds around pretty good up there! But I've seen enough to know the downhills can be more difficult for me, especially when my knees start to get sore.



It's been about five months of mostly solid

training, starting with a couple laps around the Clarkston Junior High School track in March, which seemed like plenty

My farthest run was from the office in downtown Clarkston around Clarkston High School up to the entrance to Independence Oaks County Park, around Mill Pond to St. Dan's, and back—around 10 miles. This would equal 40 laps around that track. That would be difficult to count.

It's also a Crim run – the 10-mile race up in Flint every August. I've finished a few of those, but have never been able to run more than half of that.

I cut my weekend short a day last weekend in Detroit in part to get in one more weekend training run. I was at Youmacon, the annual anime convention in the Renaissance Center and Cobo Hall.

I dressed as a zombie on Friday – seemed appropriate with Halloween and all – and a space marine on Saturday.

I found myself on the other side of the news camera, Saturday – a Detroit News photographer snapped a picture of me in my Voyage Trekkers' Marine outfit.

Maybe it was my custom-built raygun, made from a toy bazooka and PVC pipe, about four-feet long and wired with LED lights. I should still be on their website photo album for Youmacon, surrounded by dozens of cartoon, movie and video game heroes and villains, Homestuck Trolls, and other characters.

As the weather gets cold, I've found it harder to stay warm. Last year, I kept my house at 60 degrees — I put on a sweatshirt and the cats grew extra fur. This year, two sweatshirts aren't enough. The one good thing about extra weight is it keeps you warm.



As Disney proclaims, it's a small world after all!.




October may be known by most people as the beginning of Autumn, play-off baseball, or hunting season, but to fire departments across the country, October is known as Fire Prevention Month.







The Wolves began their season with a shutout against Rochester Adams on Aug. 29,53-0.



## Mascot makes like a ghost while sign issue resolved

A mascot at the Big Boy Restaurant in Clarkston has been banned.

Standing along Dixie Highway, the restaurant's 12-foot-tall trademark is dressed up as a ghost until owner John Nannini figures out what to do with it.

Nannini said this isn't the first time the mascot has been targeted by Independence Township for violating a sign ordinance, with the most recent incident occurring about three weeks ago.

Nannini said he purchased the statue about 13 years ago.

"Families look forward to bringing in their family and taking a picture with the Big Boy," said Nannini.

"He's our pillar," said waitress Melanie

Nannini said before he purchased the Clarkston location in 2000, he worked in Big Boy corporate traveling the country to different Big Boy restaurants, so he has seen many restaurants, and knows how important the statue is for business.

In Waterford, two of the Big Boy restaurants closed. Nannini said his customers have asked if he is closing down, too. They seemed to relate the vanishing Big Boy statue to the restaurant's demise.

Nannini estimates when the statue is gone, his sales go down about 15 percent.

Nannini said after he put the Big Boy outside, a code enforcer from Independence Township told him it violated an Independence Township sign ordinance.

Nannini said after the first time Big Boy

after a cold front tracked through the Great Lakes region bringing in high winds.

The strongest winds, recorded at the closest weather monitoring system located at the Pontiac Airport, recorded the highest wind gusts at 48 miles per hour around 2 a.m. Thurs-

"It was windy," said Orow. "Our highest gusts were recorded at 35 miles per hour."

Orow after the winds reseeded the rest of the day was calm. "Although it was cooler," she said. "It dropped from 60 degrees on Thursday to 48 degrees on Friday.'

Donerson said windy conditions are often the culprit of power outages. After Thursday and Friday outages, the DTE crews worked throughout the day to restore power, she said adding that all of the outages were to be fixed that day.

Donerson said DTE can tell when a customers power goes out.

"We have a few ways we can tell when the power goes out. Many times our customers will call our 1-800-477-4747 number and that is always helpful," she said. "We also a low pressure system swept through the area

have an advanced metering program that we receive signals from and that's why Smart Metering program is so effective."

Donerson said when outages are recorded, DTE has a highly skilled team that works to decide where to send crews. Crews will usually respond to areas with the highest number of outages.

"We mobilize our crews 24 hours a day seven days a week," she said. "We always work around the clock to restore power when the power goes out."

Donerson added high winds can down trees and snap power lines, and if you see one to be cautious and stay away.

"If you ever see a downed power lines stay 20 feet away from the wire and anything touching it especially a metal fence," she said.

Donerson added people should always assume a power line is live and electrified. If you spot a downed power line call 9-1-1 and DTE Energy to report the problem.



"That's our next piece," Parr said. "It'll take our production to the next level."


"We'll be able to access new sounds, a different way to create music." Rankin said.

3 decades in Navy for Clarkston grad

Mark Doolin retired recently as a Command Master Chief after 30 years in the U.S. Navy, with a diverse career in peacetime and war around the world, including frigates, aircraft carriers, and the Pentagon.

"Not bad for a punk from Clarkston," Doolin said. "I kept pretty busy. It was a great career. I loved every minute."

When he enlisted in December 1983, the United States was still facing off against the Soviet Union in the Cold War. He hunted Russian submarines with Patrol Squadron 93 and the frigate USS Jack Williams – for surveillance, not combat.

"They'd watch us, we'd watch them," he

The '90s started with a bang – he served in combat on the Williams during the First Gulf War in 1991. The decade also heralded the fall of the Soviet Union. For Doolin, that meant anti-drug operations with the U.S. Coast Guard on P3 Orion planes, providing aerial surveillance of drug smugglers.

"We'd find them from the air. It was interesting," he said.


He was on duty during terrorist attacks on Sept. 11, 2001, as well as anthrax and DC sniper cases. On Sept. 11, he was working in his Pentagon office about 50 feet from impact.

"That wasn't a good day, I can tell you that. You never expect one day go to work and a plane hit the building," he said. "After the attacks, it was war, game on with everything."

After 9-11, he served several tours in Iraq and Afghanistan. Returning from his first deployment, local and national news were on hand, with cheering crowds to welcome them.

"It was a good feeling. It's a shame every veteran doesn't experience that," he said.

"It's great to hear, people thank me and

us for our service. I always thank them for caring."

He later served as wing command master chief with Electronic Attack Squadron 209 VAX-209, in charge of hundreds of sailors, pilots, and their carrier-based electronic warfare jet aircraft.

"I'll remember the people I served with, they're the most important," he said. "I never thought I'd have the opportunity for 30. I've been very fortunate, in the right place at the right time, with great people to work with."

Doolin graduated from Clarkston High School in 1978.

"Clarkston was a neat town to grow up in, everybody knew everybody," he said.

He would hang out with friends downtown. A popular spot was the stoop in front of *The Clarkston News* office next to Rudy's, as well as the hardware store on the

corner and Dick Morgan's auto shop.

"I was pretty lucky to grow up in an environment like that," he said.

As a teen, he grew his hair long and was a founding member of Pontiac-based rock band "Topper," and was a member of "Risin High."

They performed throughout the Detroit area, including as featured house band during the 1982 Super Bowl in Pontiac.

"I did that, but then it was time to grow up and get a real job," he said. "I still mess around with the guitar. It was a great chapter in my life."

Looking to enlist, he intended to talk to a Marine recruiter, but he wasn't in his office. The Navy recruiter was, though.

"He asked what I was doing, and I said I was there to talk to the Marines, and he said,

Asked what he likes to do, he said, "drink and fight," and was told he would make a great sailor.

"That's how I got into it," he said. "But I applied myself."

At his retirement ceremony, he was surprised on stage when his captain presented him with an American flag, video, and letters.

"I would take that flag into combat. It's been everywhere," Doolin said.

But now that star-spangled banner had been flown in Joe Louis arena, Ford Field, and Comerica Park, taken to locker rooms with the Detroit players, as well as DTE Music Auditorium and on a 5K cancersurvivors' run.

"I'm a cancer survivor myself, " Doolin he said.

The video featured congratulations for his service from pro athletes, and rock stars like Kid Rock, Bob Seger, Alice Cooper, and Ted Nugent.

"Everyone was, 'oh my God,' no one could believe it," Doolin said. "It was really neat."

The flag, along with the video and letters, now rests in a shadow box over his fireplace.

"The opportunity fell into my lap. It's interesting and rewarding," he said.





Continued from page 1 United States, and money is short to build or widen new roads, the roads are often congested. Cameras help

keep the traffic flowing.


In addition to sending the information to the computer at the intersection, the computer also sends it to a regional computer monitoring network-wide traffic flow and balancing it along major corridors

Traffic engineers can also monitor intersections if there is an accident, he said.

FTAS begin in 1992 and similar cameras have been installed in 600 locations around the country.

Bryson said the project started off as a research project and has received heavy funding.

"The project has received over \$100 million in special funding and grants," he said.
