Working with the administration and passing on to the student body the various policies of the school represents a few of the duties of our student council.



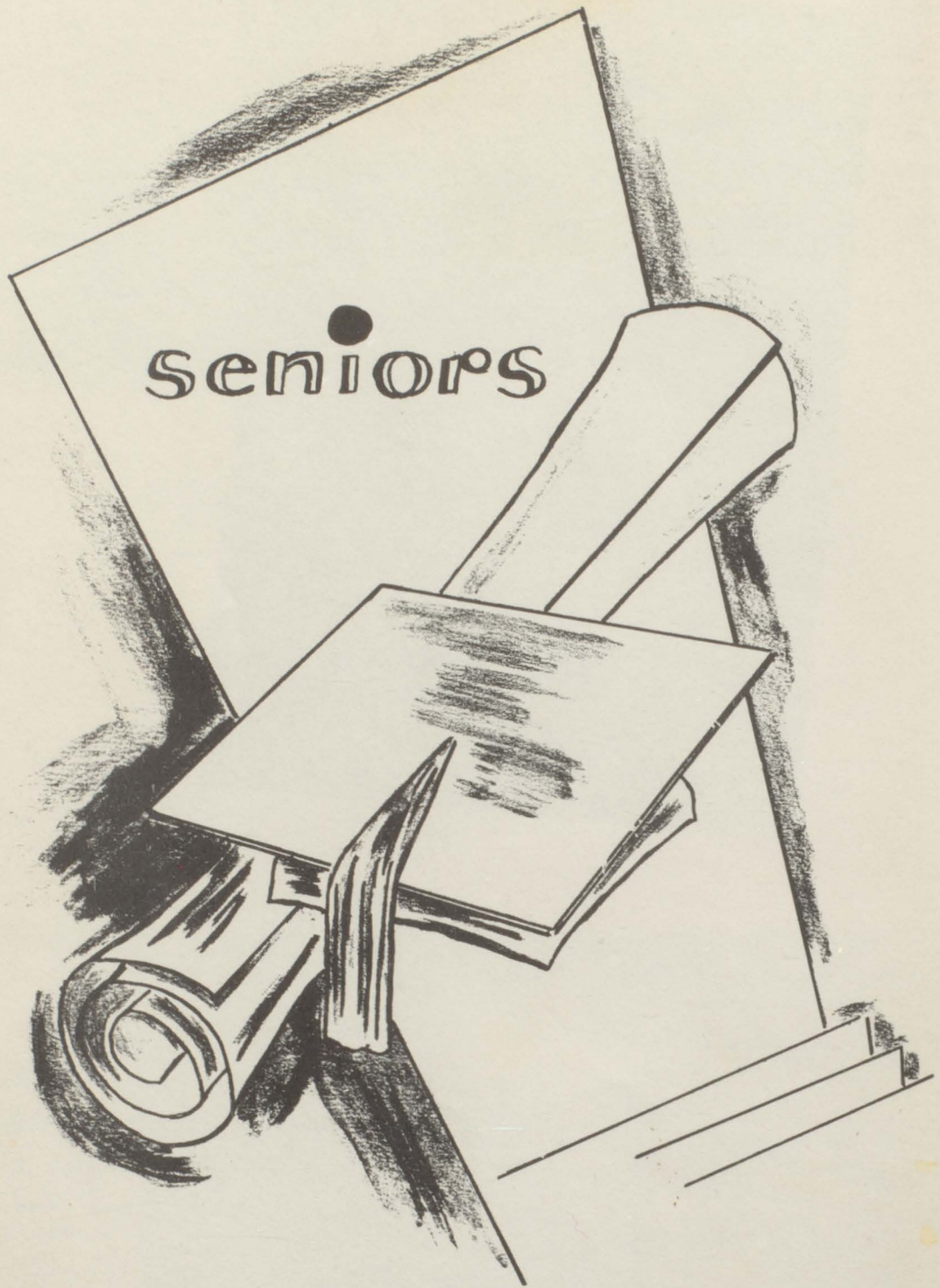
