New Anesthetic Scientists have long been search. easant side effects for the patient. Without anesthetics, modern nedicine could not attempt life-saving surgery. A new anesthetic, tested by doc-

tors at the University of California
Medical School
Hospital, recently

Viadril, when in-

viadril, when injected intravenously and combined with inhaled nitrous oxide, provided effective and safe anesthesia for 130 patients of Dr. Frank J. Murphy and his assoviadril is a steroid — like such compounds as cortisone—but it does not exhibit any hormone-like effects when injected in humans.

The new anesthetic was developed al laboratories of Chas. Pfizer & Co., Inc., after a screening program which tested more than 100 new steroid compounds.
First hint of the anesthetic-like qualities of the steroids came more than 20 years ago when Dr. Hans reported that steroids exhibit a sed-ative effect in laboratory mice. Other scientists, in the first decades of this century, developed the local, spinal and intravenous anes-thetics in use today. Ether and laughing gas came into general use less than 100 years ago, but were great advances over the earlier an-eathetics such as marijuana, hen-bane, mandrake root and cocaine. Scientists believe Viadril will supply the surgeon another useful tool and may well open a whole new area in the field of anesthesiology.
