**One Year Ago—**

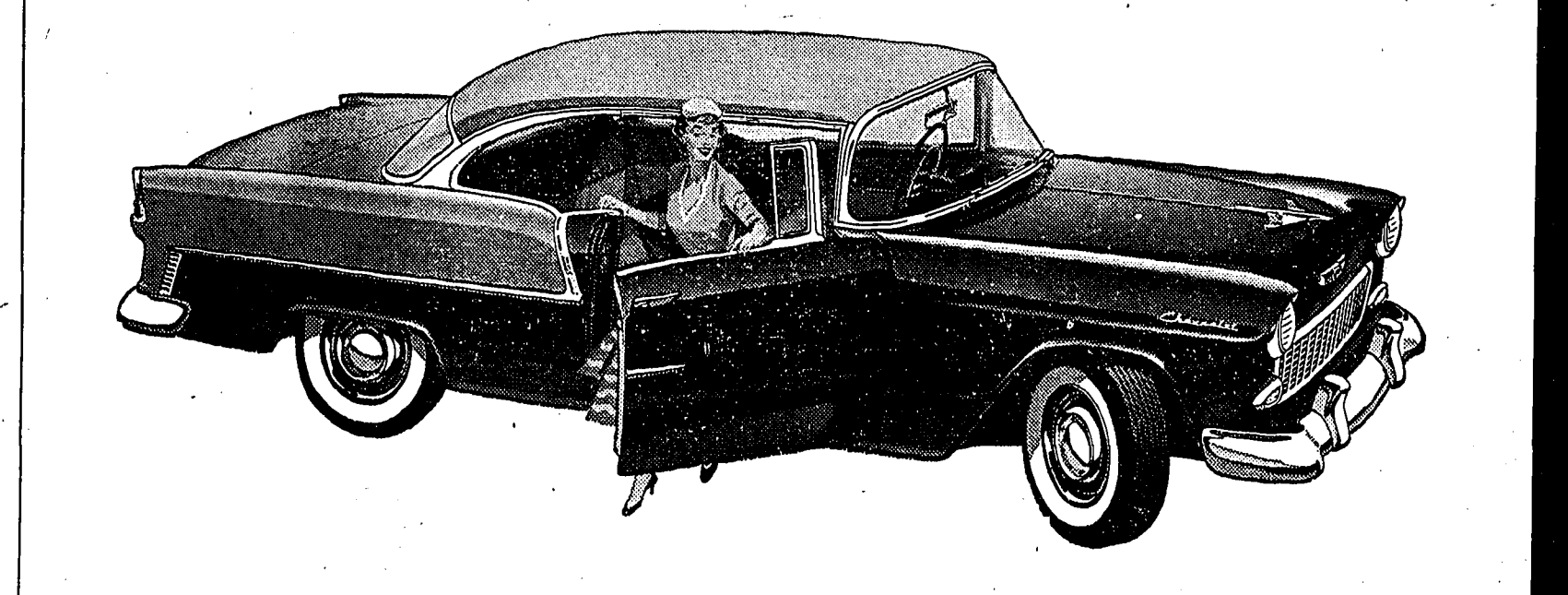

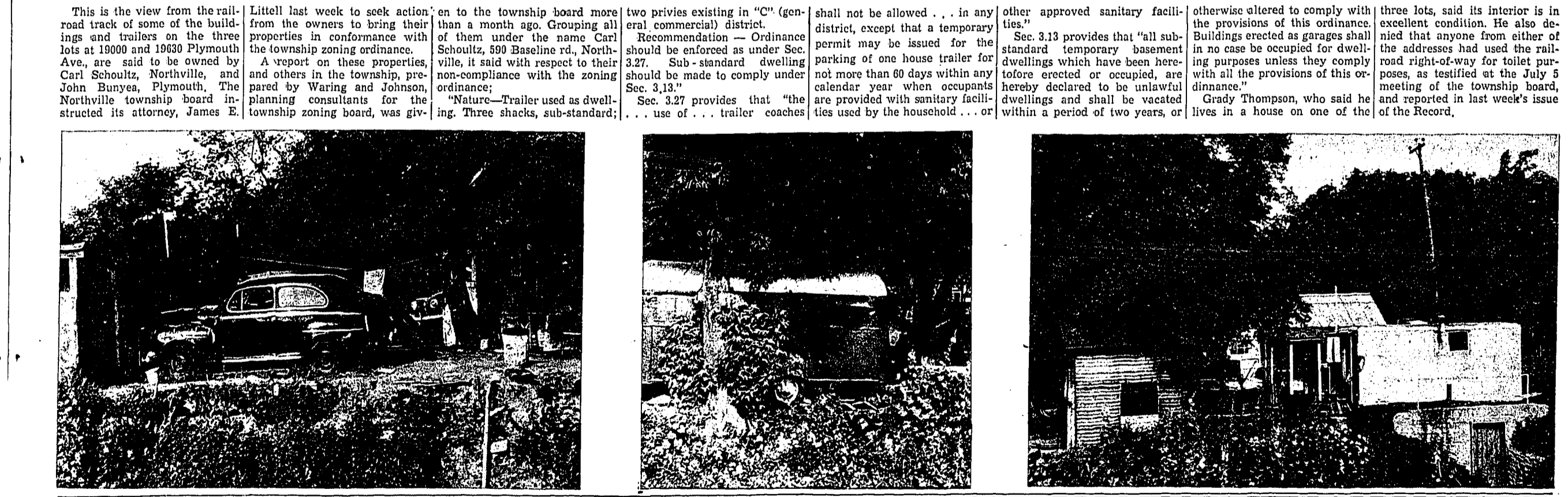

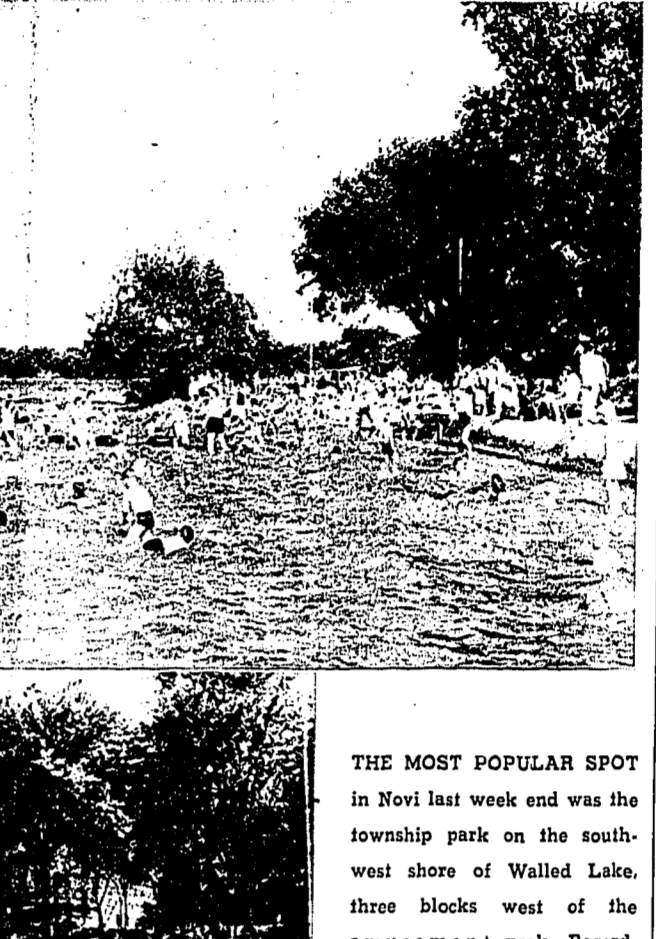
