P-TA Chairman Tells Why Parents Should Write To Senators In Wash.

In a recent release to the Northville Record, P-TA legislative chairman, Alfred P. Gall, told why parents should write to Senators Potter and McNamara in Washington, D.C. Gall's letter follows:

"The Washington Conference on Education, held in the latter part of November, highlighted for the public what has long been known by educators in our country. It was generally agreed that most of the states in our country cannot begin to provide sufficient classrooms, and adequately trained teachers, to properly educate our children.

"It is estimated that at the current building rate, there will be a shortage of 407,000 classrooms by 1959; at present there are 700,000 children on double sessions; at present children are attending classes in tents, stores, lodges and church basements. The record in Michigan is nothing to brag about. Many schools in our state are unsanitary, overcrowded, hazardous fire-traps.

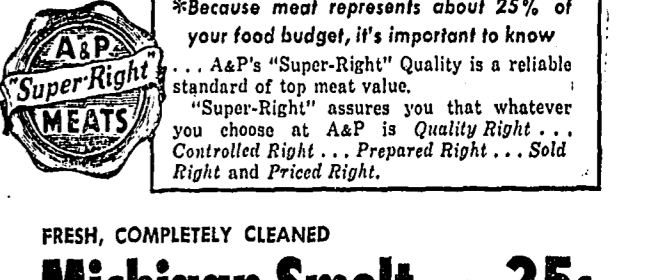

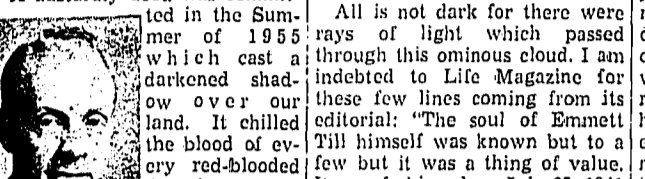
