

## NEW POST OFFICE TO BE BUILT SOON

### Building Will Be Ready For Use In Late Spring

Plans for construction of a new Novi post office to be completed by late spring were announced Wednesday by Harry Watson, Novi businessman.

The post office, which will be adjacent to and directly north of the present building, was approved by postal authorities in Washington early this month, Watson said.

Preparation of the site for building began early this week with the removal of several large trees which occupied the property.

"Actual construction will start very soon," Watson added, and we hope to have the building completed by late spring.

Using cinder block and steel construction, the new building will be approximately twice as large as the present building, almost 60 feet long.

Present plans call for vacating the old post office upon completion of the new one. Watson said that the old building will be rented for commercial purposes.

In the event that the flow of mail eventually gets too heavy for the new building to handle, it will be possible to join the two buildings at any time, he added.

### Five Contracts Awarded for US-16

Five new contracts, including four bridges and a 7½-mile stretch of highway, were awarded for the new Farmington-Brighton expressway this week by the Michigan State Highway Department.

A bridge to carry the Old Plank Rd. over the expressway about two miles east of New Hudson was awarded to Nolan and Jarvis Construction Co. of Centerline on a bid of \$133,823.

A bridge to carry the Millford Rd. over the expressway went to the same company on a bid of \$225,956. This project will consist of two bridges, one for eastbound and one for westbound traffic.

Johnson-Greene Co. of Ann Arbor were awarded the contract for a bridge carrying Meadowbrook Rd. over the expressway about two miles east of Novi. The bid was \$131,716.

W. H. Harvie of Detroit bid \$144,707 to be awarded the contract for carrying Haggerty Rd. over the expressway about two miles east of Novi.

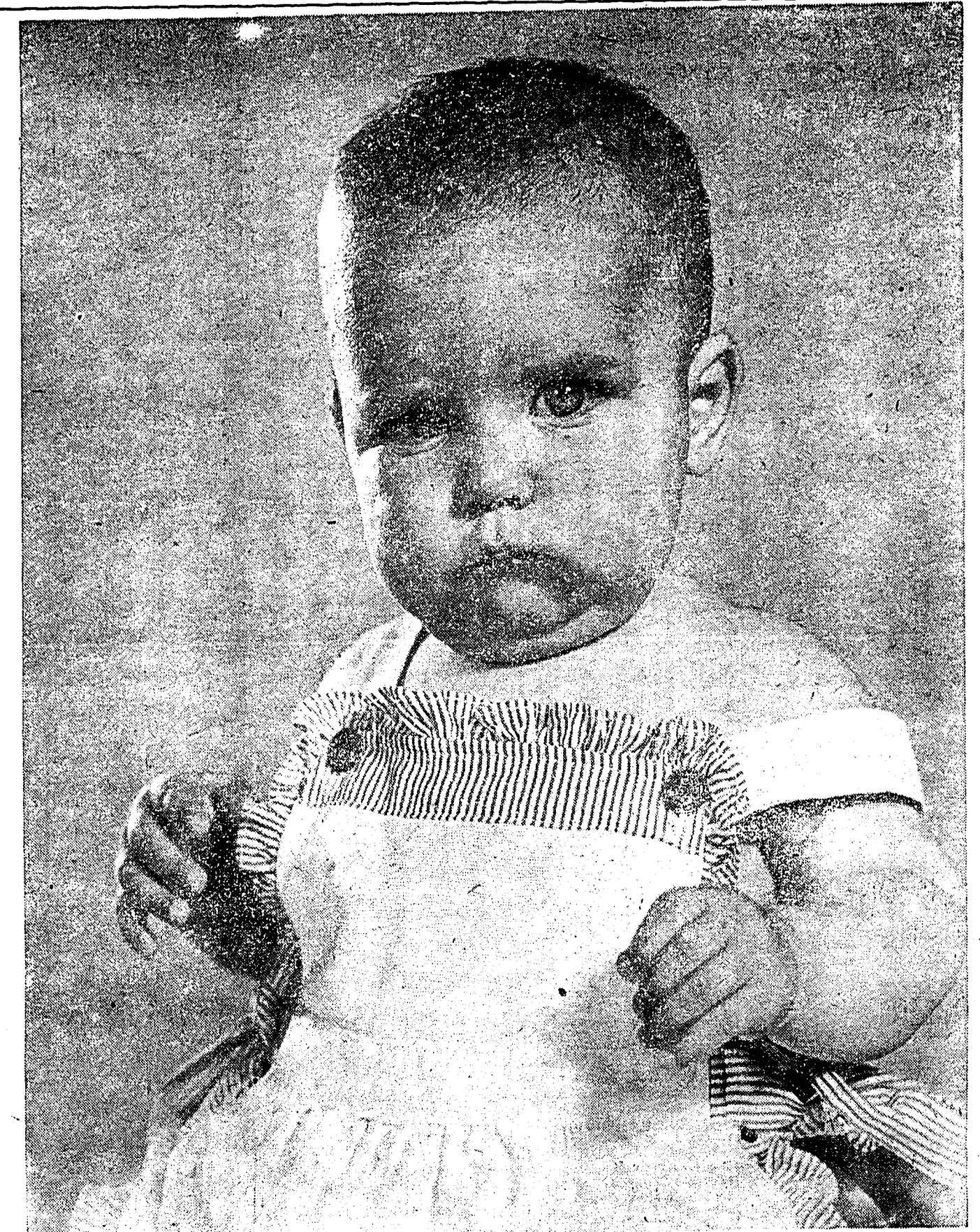

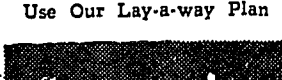

INDIAN PUDDING Pour 2 cups scalded milk on to 3/4 cup of corn meal and cook in a double boiler for 20 minutes. Then add and stir in 1/2 cup molasses, 1 teaspoon of salt, 1/4 cup sugar, 1 teaspoon cinnamon or ginger, or 1/2 teaspoon each of the two spices, 1/2 teaspoon cloves (powdered), 1/2 cup of raisins if desired and 1/2 cup of butter or margarine.

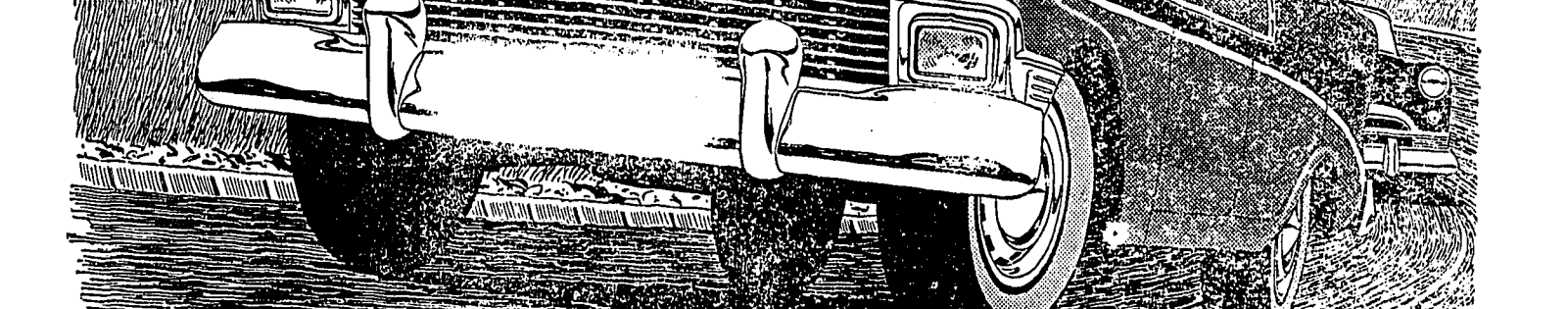

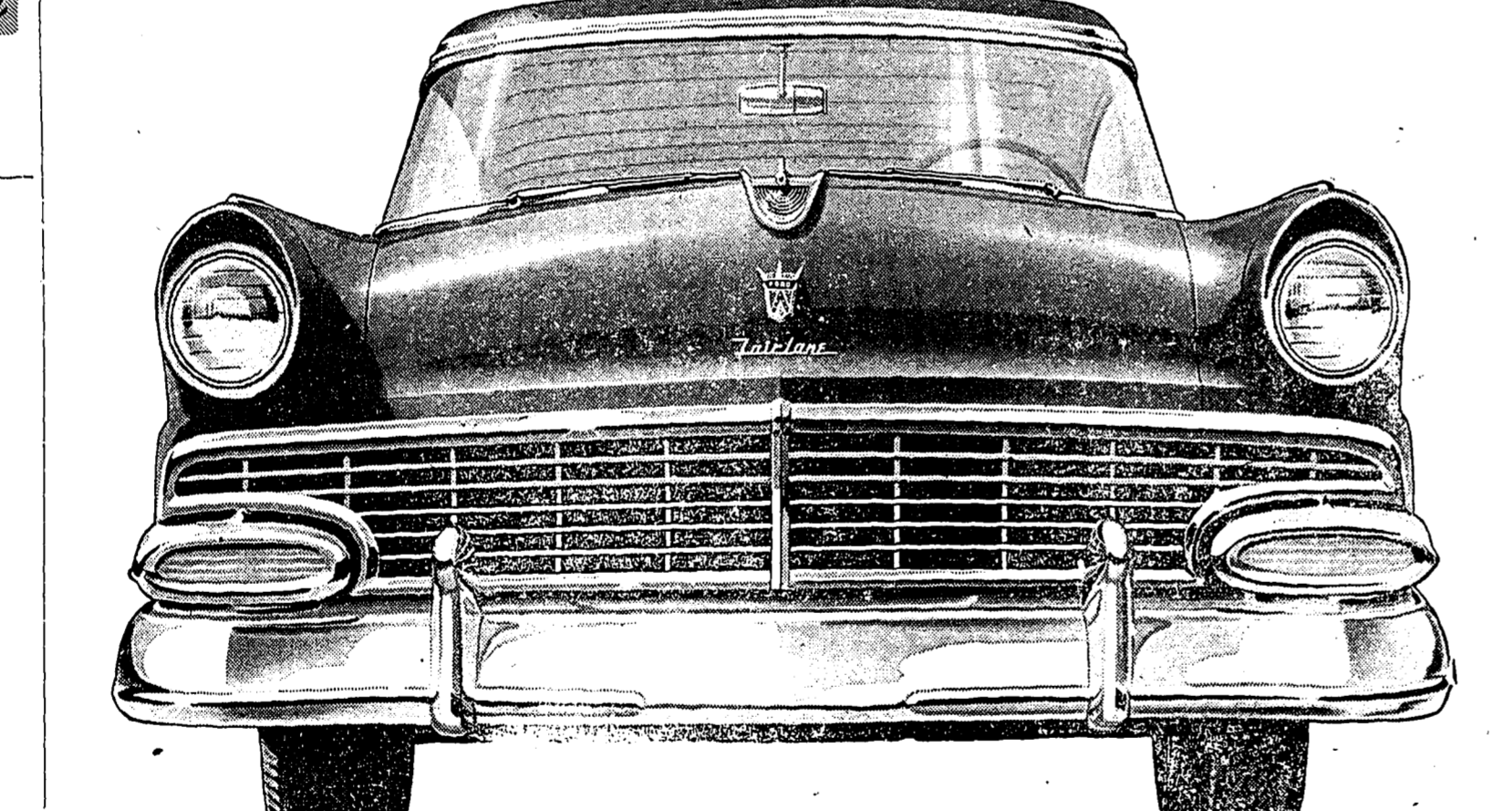
