## for the Record

"He who laughs last laughs best" might be an appropriate heading for the lead story in this week's paper to the effect that there will be a special election in both the City of Northville and Novi township on June 21 to vote upon annexation of the so-called Novi township on June \_\_\_\_\_ "Yerkes farm" to the city. Volume 1, Number 51, 14 Pages

Such a heading, although perhaps appropriate, would no cause for self congratulation by either municipality because it would have a flavor that bodes ill for the kind of neighborl relations that should be a source of strength instead of between the two communities. Unfortunately they seem to gradually drifting apart as a result of understandable community pride which is reflected inevitably in the acts and policies of elected officials in both Novi and Northville.

The foregoing may be largely unintelligible to those readers who failed to read our lead story last week, which referred to "the slightly amused attitude of Novi officials as they sit back and wait for further developments south of the border." Their amusement arose from an oversight by the Secretary of State's office in notifying Novi township that it must hold a special election on June 5 to vote on permitting annexation of the Yerkes property to the City of Northville. Novi township has been fighting a delaying action since last summer to stall a vote on annexation while Northville officials have been just as anxious to have the election held. When Novi township refused to cooperate willingly Northville got the legislature to amend the election law to author ize the secretary of state to call such an election upon petition by

Upon telephone advice from the secretary of state Northville advertised a notice of registration for special election in the paper last week. Novi township's legal adviser ruled that the township could not run a similar advertisement legally until it had received formal written notice from the secretary of state. The written notice didn't arrive in Novi until one day ofter the paper had gone to press, so the advertisement wasn't run and the election had to be postponed until June 21.

All of which would be relatively unimportant if it did not point up a conflict of interest between Novi township and the City of Northville that probably will crop up from time to time over the next few years.
