

Atom Age Comes To Northville

spark-shooting device made of cupcake tins and mixing bowls hat could pack enough wallop to kill a cow or light a house. The device goes by various names among scientists. Some call it a "particle accelerator". Others say it's an "electrostatic generator.' To the layman, however,

there's a simpler term for it: an atom smasher, But its maker, Northville high school senior Bernhard Mueller.! is quick to assure neighbors and fellow students that he does not intend to go around smashing atoms. The device is purely for demonstration and has been buil so as to be harmless.

Bernhard constructed the atom smasher in six weeks, using ma terials that could be found in most homes: two cupcake tins, a pair of metal mixing bowls, a vacuum cleaner motor, a few strips of felt and a couple pieces of plastic. Total cost of the homemade power plant: \$20.
