First Settlers Built Along Indian Trail

(Editor's Note: This is the second in a series of articles on the history of Novi township, originally written as a master's degree thesis by William O'Brien, a Southfield high school teacher who lives in Willowbrook Village.)

FRONTIER SETTLEMENT

When the first frontier farmers began to settle in the Novi region, moving out along Indian trails from Detroit, they must have been pleasantly surprised to find this rolling country, covered with mixed oak, maple, and pine, and clean

Clearing the land for farming would be hard work, but the forest and land was a contrast to the report about this region. Many, no doubt, had heard of Tiffin's report of 1815, which described the area around Detroit as almost entirely marsh and swamp. The report read:

"The intermediate space between the swamps and Jakeswhich is probably near one-half of the country - is with very few exceptions, a poor, barren, sandy land on which scarcely any vegetation grows, except very small scrubby oak. The streams are generally narrow and very deep compared with their width, the shores and bottoms which are - with very few exceptions - swampy beyond description; and it is with utmost difficulty that a place can be found over which horses can be conveyed in safety." However, even in the face of this report, frontier farm

ers pushed west seeking a new life, and new and cheap lands n the wilderness outside Detroit.

The first settler in Novi township laid claim to a quartersection of land at what is now the corner of 10 Mile and Haggerty roads. Ten Mile itself has once been a popular Shiawassee Indian trail between Detroit and the Grand River The first settler had pushed west through the swamps

surrounding Detroit, moved on past the 10 or 12 families which had settled in Farmington the previous year, and with his family built a cabin in a clearing adjacent to what was an ancient Indian burial ground. His cabin was a full mile from the nearest cabin in

Farmington, on a tributary of the Middle Rouge River that served as his water supply. Thus, in 1824, farming came to Novi township.

OPENING THE ERIE CANAL

During the next 25 years growth was rapid. The completion of the Eric Canal in October, 1825 caused an increasng volume of settlers to move across Lake Erie on sailing and new steam vessels, which had been operating on the lake only about seven years. Michigan, up to this time, had largely been passed by

because of its distance north of the main routes west, es-Michigan's population in 1820 was just less than 9,000,

compared to almost 400,000 in 1850. In Oakland county there were 339 people in 1820, and over 31,00 in 1850. Novi also filled in rapidly from zero in 1820 to about 1,500 in 1850. 

We often hear from parents that football is too rough and they don't want their sons playing because of the possibility of permanent injury. Yet, since coming to Northville more boys have been seriously injured in automobile accidents than what have been injured playing football. This isn't only a local statistic but one that exists nationwide. Why is this? First, there is supervision. The equipment,

the officials and the rules make the game as safe as possible. Second, football players at NHS have the best equipment that money can buy. It is second to non, thanks to your continued support at the games. Third, the service of our local doctors is available at all

varsity games which is a relief to the coaches, the players, and NHS does not provide accident insurance for our football players; we are not in the insurance business. We do,

however insist that every boy out for football have some form of insurance. The most common is the MHSAA benefit plan which costs a boy \$3.50 per year and covers them for all the sports. If a boy does not play football the cost is \$1.50. We feel this is a good investment considering the benefits. The MHSAA Benefit Plan is not in the business to make money. Every penny they receive in fees is distributed to the member schools. But this year another insurance company has a plan costing \$6 for football, although better, it still does not give \$10,000 - and i seriously doubt that many parents would want to pay the premium fees required






