## **ORDINANCE NO. 13**

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NOV

THE TOWNSHIP OF NOVL OAKLAND

COUNTY, MICHIGAN, ORDAINS:

PART L. That Ordinance No. 2, known as the Zoning Ordinance of The Township of Novi, is hereby amended by amending Section 10.02 of Article X of said Ordinance to read as follows

Section 10.02 BUILDING HEIGHT. No building, hereafter erected or altered in any M-1 District, shall exceed forty (40) feet or three (3) stories in height; provided, however, such height may be increased one (1) foot for each five (5) feet by which such building is set back in excess of one hundred (100) feet from the property lines.

PART II. That Ordinance No. 2, known as the Zoning Ordinance of the Township of Novi, is amended by adding thereto the following provision: The followings lands situate in Town 1 North, Range 8 East, Novi Township, to-wit, the East one-half  $(E_{2}^{1/2})$  of the Southeast one-quarter  $(SE_{2}^{1/4})$  of Section 6 and that portion of Section 7, aggregating 275 acres, more or less, lying north of the north line of the New Farmington-Brighton Expressway and east of a line parallel to and distant 1000 feet, more or less, from the west line of said Section 7 are hereby rezoned from RIF-District-Small Farm District and AG District-Agricultural District to M-1 District: Light Industrial District, and said lands may be devoted to the uses permitted by Section 10.01 of Article X of said Ordinance. Part III. That Ordinance No. 2, known as the Zoning Ordinance of the Township of Novi, is hereby amended by

dinance are hereby declared to be immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety and are hereby ordered to take effect upon final enactment and publication hereof PART VI. VALIDITY. Should any section, clause or pro-

vision of this Ordinance be declared by the courts to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof.

Just within its present boundaries it faces a growth in school population in the next 10 years ranging from a "probable" 83% to a "possible" 140%.






