



It will cost upwards of \$500,-000 for the five mile route. In revealing the plans, Oak-

land county highway engineer Paul Van Roekel called Novi road "one of Oakland county's worst conditions." Van Roekel said the three miles

from Northville to Grand River are scheduled to be completed in 1959 and the two miles from Grand River to Walled Lake in 1960.

The project would cost about \$100,000 a mile, he said. But he emphasized that the plans are still in the tentative stage, and that unforeseen developments could throw the project off schedule.







One of the toughest jobs a coach has is substituting. When he makes replacements in the ball game and whom he sends in are problems that take thorough consideration before he makes the move.

When should a substitution be made? This depends upon several things. Are some of the players tiring? Has the other team changed its offense to the extent that some player on the bench would do a better job at this time? Is one of the boys not playing up to his ability? Are we far enough ahead point-wise that some of the other fellows should have a chance

It is only right that every player on the varsity squad should have an opportunity to get into the contest. I believe this is true with the exception that it does not jeopardize your chances of winning. I have never known a coach who did not feel badly after a contest if he did not get all of his boys into the ball game - even if he won. A victory is a team victory because if it were not for the fine effort put forth by the second team in practice sessions there would be no victories.

Some people criticize the coach because it appears that he is being unfair in not getting more boys into a game. This is their privilege. I wonder what their comments would be if we lost a game because the coach was too free with his bit more difficult to bag Brown. obstitutions

Whom you should put into a contest depends upon the many things too numerous to explain here. Generally you try to match the sub to the general playing characteristics of the man leaving the game and the man he is to guard.
